"The International Harvester Company last year made only \$150,000 in profits, or fifteen hundredths of one per cent, according to R. O. Haskins, the president, who testified today before a special examiner in the government's suit to dissolve the corporation under the Sherman Anti-Trust Law."

Questions were asked by the government's attorney to show that the International Harvester Company of America was merely the selling agent of the International Harvester Company of New Jersey and that the latter company was to make the money.

"It is not your object to buy from the New Jersey Corporation at such a price as will enable you to sell so that you will have neither a loss nor a profit?" asked Edward P. Groves, special assistant attorney general.

"Our object is to buy as cheaply as we can and make as much as possible. We try to buy from the New Jersey company at prices we would get from any other company," replied Mr. Haskins.

"But you never have paid a dividend?" "We never have."

Most of today's session was devoted to describing technical features of farm implements. Mr. Haskins related the methods of sale to farmers in answer to the government's charge that as a trust, the Harvester company maintained prices "to the serious injury of the farmer."

The witness said the company sold to agents with a five per cent. discount for cash and the agents by adding his profit determined the price the farmer was to pay. One reason, Mr. Haskins explained, why the sales company made only \$150,000 while it sold \$100,000,000 worth of implements was that it was constantly expanding its business and expending large sums for advertising.

ANALYSIS OF VOTE LAST SEPTEMBER.

OTTAWA, Sept. 17—Out of a total of over 1,350,000 electors whose names were on the voters' lists, 669,567 voted for Conservative candidates, 625,096 voted Liberal and 12,865 voted for Independent Labor and Socialist candidates. The Conservatives polled 44,461 votes more than the Liberals. The rural polls give a popular Liberal majority of upward of thirty thousand.

These are some of the salient facts to be deduced from a study of a booklet just issued by the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery, Mr. J. G. Foley, giving figures by polling subdivisions in last year's election.
