Air Raiders Exact 35,000 Casualty Toll

VALLEYFIELD, Que., Nov. 12.—(CP)—Nine men died in the Beaumachois Canal near here today when a tug-boat foundered after striking a concrete abutment during a high wind.

Fourteen men were thrown into the water as the Marine Industries tug Aberdeen plunged to the bottom. Only five, including a Capt. Lacrosse, skipper of the vessel, were able to reach safely along the banks of the canal.

LONDON, Nov. 12.—(AP)—Successful attacks on a German submarine base and airplane bases on both sides of the British peninsula—a wide springboard for Nazi warfare on Britain's shipping—were announced today by the Air Ministry.

Hit with "heavy high explosives," said the Ministry, were the German submarine base at Lorient, on the southern section of the peninsula, and airfields at Brest, St. Malo and St. Briac on its north. It was the third successive attack on Lorient.
