THE DEATH STRUGGLE BEFORE PORT ARTHUR.

Since the bloody battle of Kinchow the Russians have withdrawn behind their tremendous fortifications a out Port Arthur, and the past few weeks there has been a dearth of news as to what has been done by either army since the Japanese victory. However, it is evident that a series of advances have been made by the Japanese, who have been digging trenches and attempting to plant guns on the few high places about Port Arthur, which will enable them to throw shells into the Russian lines. It is known however, that the Japs have made a complete circle of forts at a radius of seven miles around Port Arthur. The dispatches are very contradictory on the subject of what luck was attended the Jap efforts to force their way either to the inner fortifications of the inv-sted fortress. The map shows Wolf Mountain and the higher hill of White Wolf Mountain, which have been occupied and fortified by the Japanese.

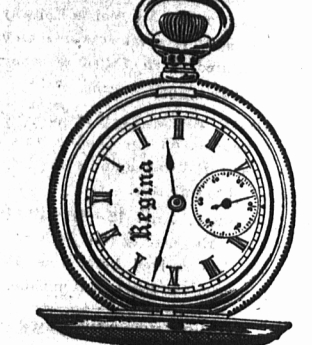
