**New Engineer**

**Instructor for Mount Allison**

There has recently been appointed to the staff of Mount Allison University, as Instructor in Engineering, Mr. Frank S. Binns, of Bradford, England. Mr. Binns, though of English birth, has been trained in the United States. After finishing school in England he came to America and served his apprenticeship to the machinist trade in Lawrence, Mass. He then entered Tufts and graduated as Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering in 1909. After nine years as draftsman and designer with several industrial concerns he turned to teaching and has been for eleven years on the staff of American Engineering Schools as Instructor in Drawing and Mechanics. This time included five years at the University of Pennsylvania and four at Purdue University. During this period he was assistant to the three of the outstanding men in America in the fields in which he will do his work at Mount Allison. Mr. Binns has also carried on Post graduate work at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, University of Illinois, Columbia and Purdue Universities, from the latter of which he received his M. Sc. degree in Mechanical Engineering. Mr. Binns will take charge of all Engineering Drawing and related courses at Mount Allison, and the University is to be congratulated in securing his services.

**MEETING BOARD OF TRADE**—At a meeting of the Board of Trade yesterday afternoon arrangements were made for the meeting of the Maritime Board here on September 23rd and 24th. A tentative programme was read and approved. The meetings will be held in the Canadian National Hotel starting at 10:30 on Wednesday morning. It is expected that the Hon. C. A. Dunning will give an address at the banquet at noon on the 24th. The Charlottetown Board appointed committees to draw up several important resolutions to be presented. Letters from the Premier and Minister of Agriculture were read with regard to the importation of western cattle to this Province both letters stating that the matter was being seriously considered. A letter from the London, Ont., Board was read warning against accepting any mechanical devices for parking cars as they had proved unsatisfactory in other cities.

**NOTES PICKUP IN PICTURE INDUSTRY**—Mr. William Guss, St. John, representing Regal Films Limited, distributors of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer Pictures and London Films Productions, is visiting Charlottetown.
