There is also a schooner loaded with rails bound for P. E. I. frozen in at the Landing. If she is compelled to winter there she will have to put off a part of her load as she is heavily laden.—New Glasgow ex.

ISLANDERS make a good showing at Amherst Winter Fair.—J. W. Callbeck, Augustine Cove, secured 1st prize for best pen of Barred Plymouth Rocks in competition with the best breeders in the Maritime Provinces, in a class of eight entries. This is the first exhibit ever made from the Brookside Poultry yard, and certainly is a guarantee of the uniformly good quality of the Brookside Poultry.
