## Will Not Visit P. E. Island.

Yesterday afternoon His Honor Lieut. Governor McIntyre received the following:

OTTAWA, 31st July, 1901.

Sir.—With reference to previous correspondence on the subject, I have now the honor by command of His Excellency the Governor General to acquaint you for the information of the City Council of the City of Charlottetown, that the arrangements for the royal tour do not include a visit to P. E. Island. It is a matter of regret to their Royal Highnesses in which His Excellency shares, that the extent of the Dominion and the shortness of the time at the disposal of the Royal party renders it impossible for their Royal Highnesses to visit our Province, and personally to testify their appreciation of the well known loyalty and devotion of its people to the British crown. 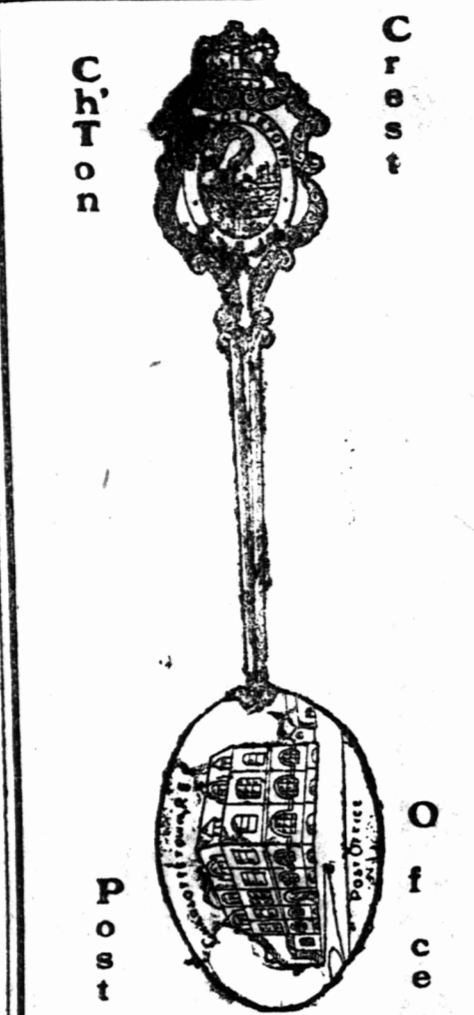
