CENSORSHIP AT HALIFAX

YESTERDAY'S MARKET.—The market yesterday was well supplied with fruit and poultry. Cherries sold at 20 cents a quart; currants 15 cents; raspberries, 20 cents; gooseberries, 12 cents; blueberries, 15 cents; green peas, 30 cents a quart; strawberries 12 to 14 cents per box. Ducks sold at 60 cents each; fowls, \$1.25 to 1.50 a pair; beef, 12 to 15 cents a pound; lamb, 15 to 20 cents; butter, 26 cents per pound.

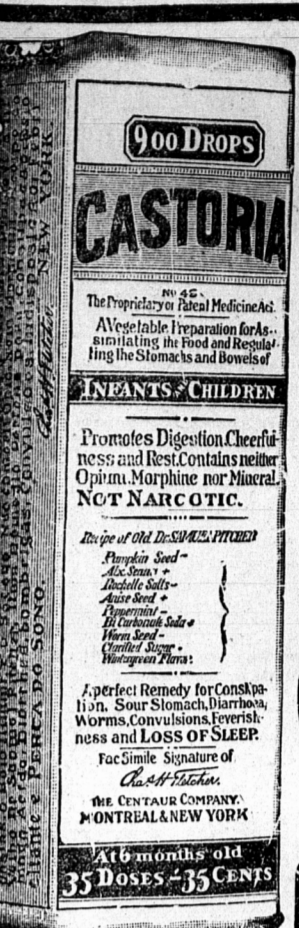
MILITARY APPOINTMENTS.—It is gazetted that Lieut. A. R. Crockett, of the Algonquin Light Infantry, has been promoted to the rank of Captain, and continues in the appointment of Signalling Officer. It is also gazetted that Capt. T. H. E. Inman and Lieut. A. C. Squarebriggs, of the Abegweit Light Infantry, have been transferred to the P. E. I. Light Horse, that Supernumerary Lieut. P. H. Crockett is absorbed into the establishment of the Light Infantry, and that Lieut. C. H. Campbell, of the Corps of School Cadets, is appointed Lieutenant in the Abegweit Regiment. The commission of Lieut. J. S. Barnall, of the P. E. I. Heavy Brigade, is announced in the same Gazette, which also contains the appointments which have been made consequent on the organization as a two-squadron of the 36th, P. E. I. Light Horse, as follows: To be Lieutenant-Colonel and to command the regiment: Major A. E. Ings; to be provisional Major, 2nd in Command: Captain L. H. Beer; to be provisional Major: Lieutenant J. A. Stewart, Captain T. H. E. Inman, from the 82nd (Abegweit Light Infantry); to be provisional Captain and Adjutant: Lieutenant W. C. Cook; to be provisional Captains: Lieutenant (supernumerary) P. P. Bell; Lieutenant A. C. Squarebriggs, from the 82nd (Abegweit Light Infantry); to be provisional Lieutenants: Thomas Wolsey Morris, Thomas Ernest Earl Robins, Charles Ernest McMurdo, Harry Leigh Bowness, Archie McMurdo, LeLurey; to be Quartermaster with the honorary rank of Lieutenant: Dennis O'Meara Reddin.

THE GARDEN PROVINCE.—In a special 24-page illustrated "Canadian Supplement," decorated on the front page with an excellent photographic reproduction of Prince Alexander of Teck, Canada's Governor-General designate, published by the "Birmingham Gazette," Prince Edward Island, "the Garden Province of Canada," is given a whole-page notice. The article is written by Mrs. J. MacAllister Fitzsimmons, from whom it receives worthy treatment. "Often referred to," she writes, "as Canada's million-acre farm, the Island is noted for its fertility and vegetation, the presence of the sea moderating the cold of winter and the summer heat, so that the verdure attains that emerald tint that suggested its being called 'New Ireland,' when a new name was sought for instead of St. John's Island, as it was originally called.

P. E. ISLANDERS TELL OF FOX FARMING AT BOSTON MEETING

Hon. Murdoch McKinnon and Mr. J. E. B. McCready have returned from Boston, where they addressed by invitation a meeting of those interested in the fox industry. The Faneuil Hall, where the gathering took place, was crowded by a kindly interested audience, fully representative of the leading people in the New England States. Mr. Donald MacPhie presided, and first called upon Mr. McCready who devoted his remarks to the rise, progress and prospects of the fox industry. Mr. McKinnon, who followed endorsed the views expressed by Mr. McCready, and then dealt at considerable length with the oyster and agricultural outlook in the Island. At the close numerous questions were asked and answered, and everyone seemed thoroughly satisfied with the information imparted.
Boston, at the time of the meeting was greatly excited over the war, and one of the questions asked was whether the war would have a detrimental effect on fox investments. Mr. McCready replied that what the ultimate effect of a general European war would be, no man could tell, but that he knew, wherever oyster and securities had fallen, and the bottom had been knocked out of the markets, fox investments still remained firm, and the fox exchanges were still doing active business.
At the conclusion a hearty vote of thanks was awarded the speakers, and the general feeling expressed was that the meeting had been the best host the fox industry has ever had in Boston.
