MONTREAL, Nov. 4.—The Canadian Pacific steamer Virginia is the first of the vessels which carried the Canadian troops of the First Overseas Contingent to England last month on return to Montreal.

We had 1,398 soldiers on board, from the First British Columbia Regiment and the Army Service Corps.

The Virginian brought about one hundred passengers from Liverpool. She had a very rough trip for this time of year, experienced three days of heavy sea and twelve hours' fog.

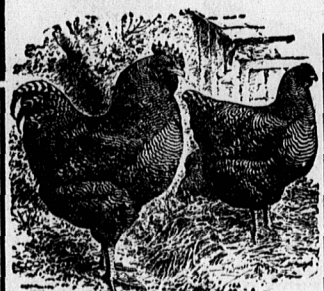

SAYS ENGLAND BACKED WRONG HORSE IN 1878

NEW YORK, Nov. 3.—The Times says editorially today: Lord Salisbury was right, England did put her money on the wrong horse in the Crimea war. She backed the wrong horse in 1878, for the Congress of Berlin rivalled the Congress of Vienna, held sixty years earlier, in its miserable bargainings, its stupidity, and its unstable adjustments out of which three wars have come and now a fourth greater than all of them.

Not to be outdone in bad judgment, Turkey herself, the direful spring of so many European wars, now records her wager. The horse she picks is showing signs of distress, but he has a good deal of "go" to him yet—so much that the Turk may mistake more than one burst of speed for a portent of victory. It was inevitable, though, if Turkey was to get into the war at all, that it should be on the German side.

Among the earlier consequences of Turkey's taking up arms against the Allies, the most nearly certain is a declaration for war against her by Greece, Roumania, also, and Bulgaria may become involved, the former as an ally of Russia, the latter perhaps joining Turkey in reinforcing Germany and Austria. The ultimate consequence will be the expulsion of the Turk from Europe for all time.
