Annual Meeting West Prince Board Of Trade

Mr. Wilfred Tanton Of Alberton Is Re-elected President.

Mr. Wilfred Tanton of Alberton was re-elected president of the Alberton and West Prince Board of Trade at the annual meeting of the Board held in Alberton yesterday afternoon.

Mr. J. Watson MacNaught, M.P., and Senator B.W. Robinson were present and addressed the gathering. Mr. MacNaught urged the necessity of exploiting every possibility of developing the tourist trade.

The following members also spoke on this matter: Messrs. Anselm O'Brien, Howard Clark, John Matthews, John Callaghan and Rev. J.M. Fraser.

Mr. Clarke spoke of the need of paying the road to Alberton wharf and of repairing the wharf. He said that whereas there used to be 40 fishing boats operating out of Alberton harbor, there are now 60.

There is also need of storage space for 18,000 lobster traps. Mr. Callaghan spoke of the need of a cold storage plant and protested against all the hospital equipment from Mount Pleasant Airport going to Summerside.
