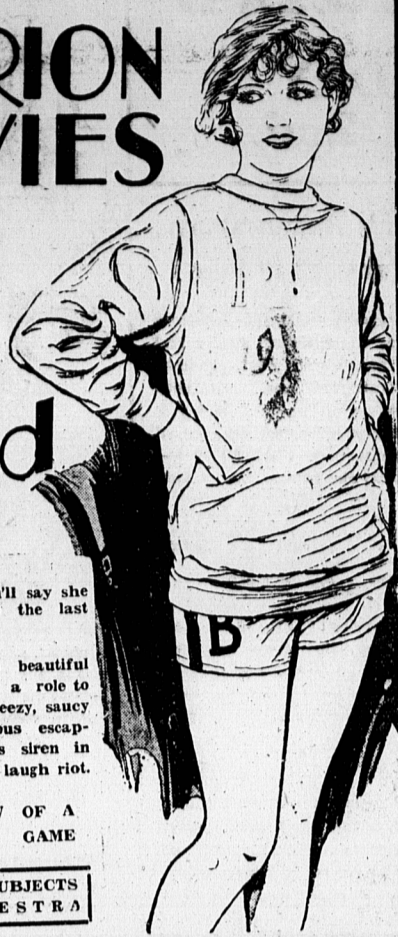

"BRUISING" CONTEST ROCKS
15,000 FANS AT THE GARDEN

NEW YORK, Nov. 26. — In one of the most furious and bruising, heavyweight battles ever staged in Madison Square Garden, Johnny Risiko, of Cleveland, tonight battled his way to the front ranks of title contenders with a clean-cut, 10-round victory over Paulino Uzcudun, of Spain, Uzcudun weighed 198 and Risiko 192.

It was a clash of a "rubber man" in Risiko and a man of cement, steel reinforced in Paulino, with the honors clearly in favor of the bounding youth from Cleveland.

For almost every minute of the struggle a slashing combat that found both exhausted at the close Risiko met the Spaniard at his own game and outslugged him. There were no knockdowns, but Paulino, victor over Harry Wills, Tom Heeney and Hansen during his invasion of America, was groggy and reeling at the close.

The huskiest of the Spaniard's drives seemed to bother him only in the sixth and eighth rounds, when the constant pounding to the mid-section tired Risiko perceptibly and one even.

In each of the 10 rounds Risiko chose to stand toe to toe with the Spaniard, pouring in a steady volume of rights and lefts to the head, while Paulino concentrated his fire on the body, and 15,000 fans rocked the Garden with their roars. There was no question of the winner at the close, a majority of ringside critics crediting Risiko with seven rounds, two for Paulino and one even.

Time and again Risiko lashed out with solid rights to the head, as they broke from clinches, and the blows frequently sent the Spaniard spinning into corners of the ring. Paulino was game to the core, however, never knew he was "licked", and even at the close, when blood streamed from his nose and lips, fought back in the toe to toe fashion that always has brought him victory here.

Although Risiko was guilty of much holding toward the finish of the bout, when each fought for wind in between clinches, Paulino drew two severe warnings from Referee Magnolia for low punching. None of the blows hurt Risiko perceptibly, however.

Berlenbach kept driving his left hook to the body at close quarters. Walker dropped left hooks to the body and then shot hooks to the chin in the second round. Berlenbach gamely absorbed these punches, twice crowding Walker to the ropes and punishing him with left ribs to the body.

The pace slowed up a bit in the third round, with Walker opening up with a hard right and left to the jaw. Berlenbach then chased him to the ropes, driving both fists to the head and body. Walker was again forcing the fight as the round ended.

Walker boxed more cautiously in the fourth, hooking his left to the body. Berlenbach refused to back up an inch, however, and was severely punished for his gameness. Walker rushed Berlenbach to the ropes, floored him with a left hook, falling down on top of him. Berlenbach was groggy when he got up, but reeled around until the bell rang.

GIVES HEAVY
MAN DRUBBING

COLISEUM, Chicago, Nov. 26. — Mickey Walker, world's middle-weight champion, failed to knock out Paul Berlenbach, one time world's light-heavyweight champion but had no trouble winning the decision in 10 savage rounds tonight.

The match, fought in the Coliseum, drew 9,000 with gate receipts of \$52,000.

Walker, conceding 11 1/2 pounds in weight, gave Berlenbach an unmerciful beating, winning every round.

He floored Berlenbach in the fourth, falling on top of him, when he followed through on his terrific left hook to the chin.

Canadian Fighter Wins
Patsy Pollock, the Canadian welterweight, gained the judges' decision in a six-round preliminary to the Mickey Walker-Paul Berlenbach fight here tonight.

Joe Quinn, Philadelphia lightweight, clearly outpointed Jerry "Red" Dolan, Chicago, in six rounds but the judges thought otherwise and they gave the verdict to the Chicago boy and then the crowd gave it to the judges, greeting the verdict with boos.

Billy Light, St. Paul, 147-pounder, won the verdict over Jack Silver, of San Francisco, in eight rounds. Silver was dropped for a count of nine in the third. He did not win a round.
