(Delaware Coast News Nov. 30) Captain Charles W. Johnston, aged 82 years one of the oldest residents of Lewes, died at his home on South street on the morning of the 25th of November.

Captain Johnston was born in Prince Edward Island, Canada. While a young man he moved to the United States and made his home in Philadelphia, and from there came to Lewes about 1875, being employed by the U. S. Government in the construction of the Iron Pier. He afterwards entered the marine contracting business, and was very successful in this line of work.

Funeral services for the deceased were held at his late residence on Wednesday afternoon, and were in charge of Rev. Dr. Wise, assisted by Rev. William Lelshman. The service at the grave was in charge of the Masonic Lodge, Captain Johnston being one of the oldest members of the local Chapter.

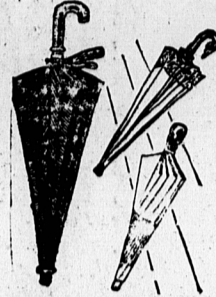
