Winter has come early and with great severity in Europe, so the cable tells. Weather prophets thereupon predict a head season during the next three months. They know absolutely nothing about it, but in the guess between mild and severe they are about as likely to be wrong as to be right, or vice versa.

Halifax City Council in April last passed a resolution accepting the offer of Mr. Carnegie to furnish \$75,000 for a public library building and pledging \$7,500 a year toward its maintenance. But after doing this it was found impracticable to agree upon a site for the building, and a few days ago the Council passed a resolution to rescind the resolution of April last. Thereupon certain parties interested obtained from Judge Weatherbie an injunction restraining the City Council from carrying into effect their resolution of November 17th rescinding their previous resolution, or of notifying Mr. Carnegie of the adoption of the rescinding resolution, or taking any steps in breach of the resolution adopted in April. It is contended that the first resolution accepting Mr. Carnegie's offer constitutes a contract between the City Council and him. The Mayor has been served with the injunction and the city will defend its position in court.

It is pointed out in connection with the appointment of Sir Richard Cartwright as a Privy Councillor of the Empire, that he is the first Colonial statesman, not a Premier, to receive that high honor. Mr. T. G. J. Raynor of the Farmers' Institute staff writes the Maritime Farmer of Sussex, N. B., an interesting article on pork production. In his introductory he falls into the slight error in speaking of negotiations now pending "with a view to establishing a packing plant at Charlottetown in the near future." Mr. Raynor seems not to know that Charlottetown has had a packing plant for five years past. He thinks that each of the Maritime Provinces should have a plant of its own, which will probably be effected in due time.

That was a capital suggestion of our correspondent Neptune, whose letter in reference to the North River Bridge appeared in The Guardian of Saturday. A new bridge at Brighton would be a boon to the city and country alike. It would be a saving of time, distance and traction for all time to come. The facilities for putting down the piers are all now at hand and it would seem that so much of the work might well be undertaken before Mr. Heney removes his plant. The superstructure could be placed later, in accordance with our correspondent's plan. The bridge to Southport and the bridge across the North River at Brighton would give the city important and valuable new outlets which must be of great advantage to both the urban and rural districts.

The esteemed evening dailies of the city cannot agree upon political questions. They cannot agree in their estimate of man. The Patriot one day discourses upon "the littleness" of the human biped and is followed by The Examiner of the next day with an eloquent passage extolling the greatness and grandeur of the same two-legged creature. But there is one question upon which they are apparently coming together—the great hog question. And when they do agree their unanimity is wonderful. The Patriot "goes the whole hog," and The Examiner is now about on about "on all fours" with it. This may be only a temporary agreement, however.
