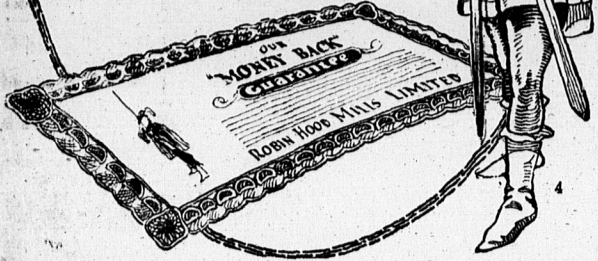

The Invaders

Up to the close of the Cleveland meeting the Canadian reinsman Fleming topped the list of winning drivers in 1922 with eleven first monies to his credit. He won over the mile track at North Randall with Silent T. It was her third victory this season, as the returns show she finished in front at Marion and Cranwood.

Fleming is one of the most successful reinsmen who cross the border each year to invade the American track. A few years ago he treks east from Calgary. After starting at a few meetings in Ontario he began making the rounds of the Michigan Circuit. From there he drifted to the mile tracks. His high water mark on the larger oval was reached at Lexington when he won in two minutes with Louie Grant.

Ben White is another Canadian that appeared behind a winner at Cleveland. He won the three-year-old pace with Anna Bradford's girl. As a boy Ben's address was Whitevale, Ontario. From that point he moved to the Village Park at East Aurora, N.Y., where he took a course in training under Edward F. Geers. When the time came for Ben to paddle his own canoe he made good. After a few sessions on the half-mile tracks he moved into the fastest company with Periscope, Princess Stawah, Brusloff, Lee Axworthy and last year's Futurity winner Lee Worthy.

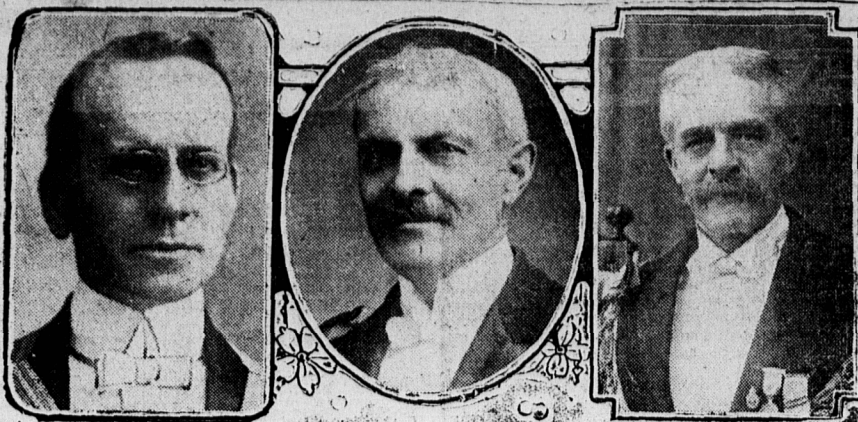
It is a rather strange coincidence that the first pacing stallion to beat two minutes and the first trotting stallion to enter that select circle were driven by Canadians. Dave McClary, who came from near London, Ontario, opened the ball in 1897 when he marked Star Pointer in 1:59 3/4 at Beadville. White scored his triumph in 1916 when he rode around the track at Lexington behind Lee Axworthy in 1:58 3/4.

Of the other Canadian invaders who are busy on the mile tracks at the present time Nat Ray is out with Peter the Brewer and Jimmy McKerron. Harry Stinson, a Brantford product, is also busy at North Randall, getting The Toddler ready for another trip to the races. In the days which are gone he raced Kentucky Todd and Saddle Mac.

In the Bay State Circuit the Ottawa lad W. T. Crozier is in the thick of the fight every race day behind such horses as Suarkie, with which he finished second to Tom McGregor in 2:08 3/4 over the half-mile track at Windsor, the three-year-old colt Coleman that was second to Sir Etawah in 2:12 and the two-year-old colt Don Seler, which chased Commodore Wilson out in 2:16 3/4 in a third heat. The ex-barber Dave Warman is another Canadian from New Brunswick, that is always making trouble on race day. At the recent Windsor meeting he shaved the bank rolls of the chest when he won with Peppercorn in 2:13 3/4. Holson was also in the money with Shawnee and S'vie Brooke.

That the Canadians have always been good horsemen is evidenced by the material that is found in their stables. The old-timers will recall Charles Wagner and his big brown mare Phyllis with which he trotted the country for several years. Dan McEwen made all stand at attention when he turned for the word with The Eel. Andy McDowell marked Alex and Azote. W. Fleming made a telling trip in the sulky behind Joe Patchen II. George Langs did almost as well with Avin.

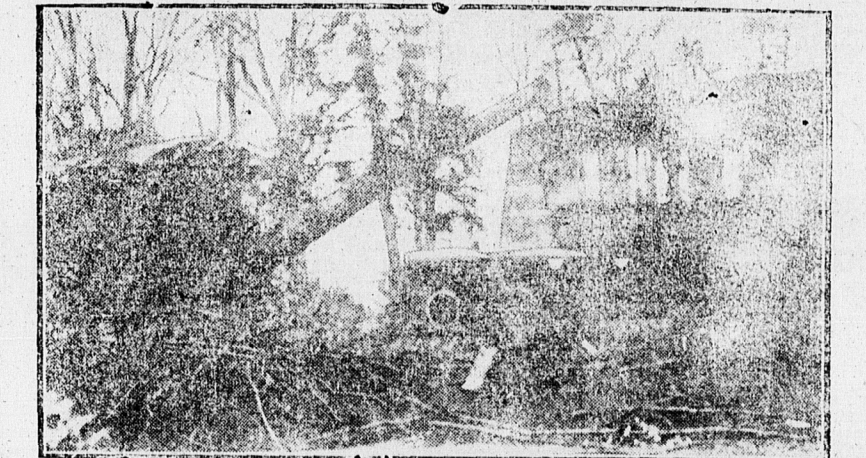
George McPherson came out of the Canadian bushes with the big gelding Angus Pointer. He was a star. When Angus Pointer was sold George made another bid with Fern Hal.



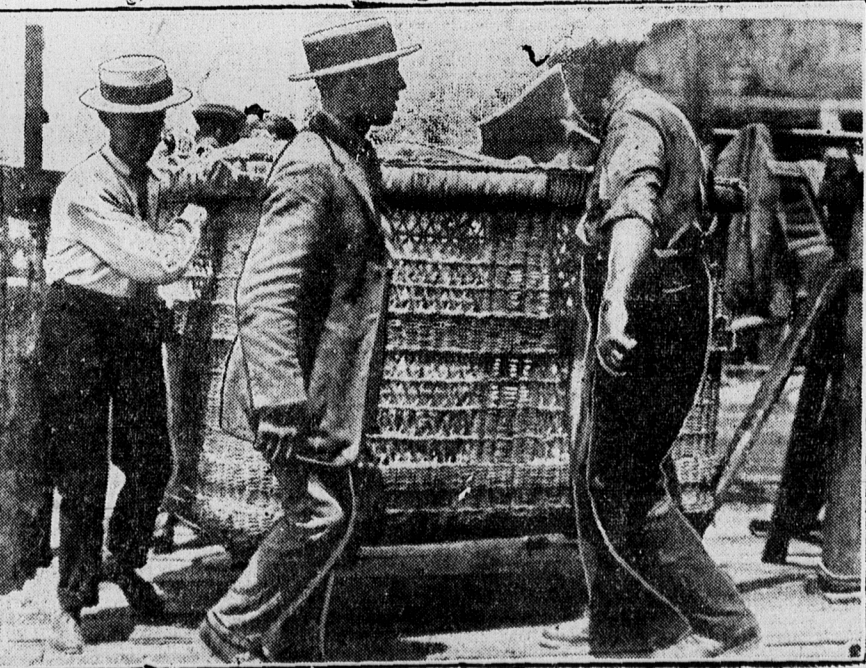

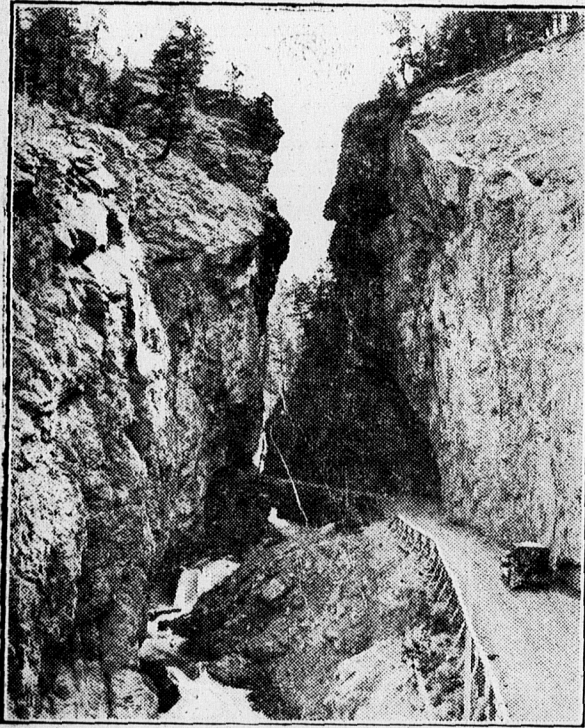

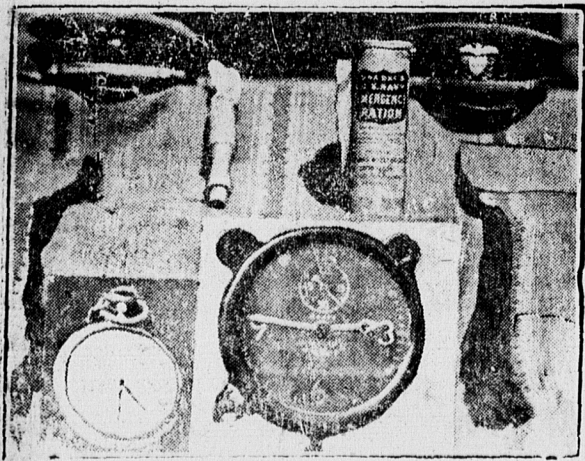

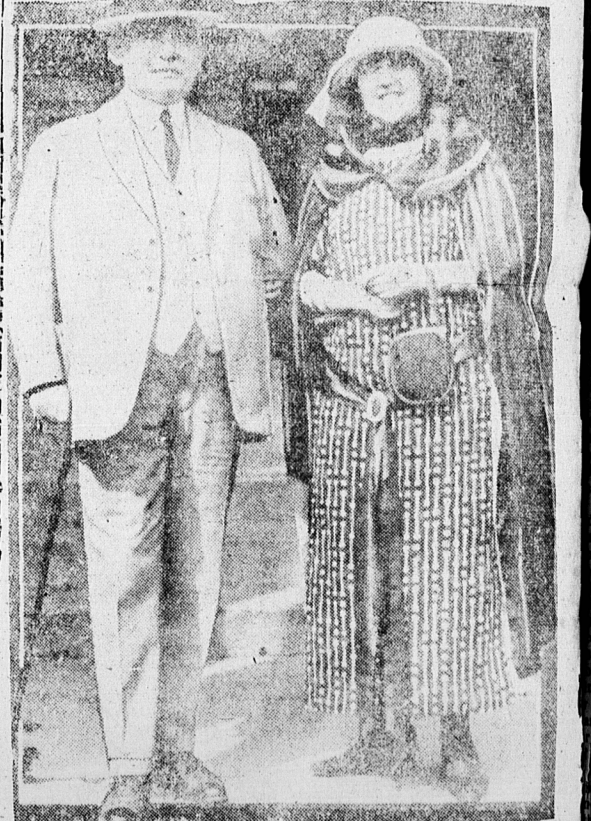
