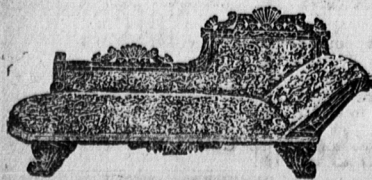

While the slower growing populations of the older Provinces are only enumerated once in ten years, Manitoba has for some time had a partial census taken at five years interval.
