Missionaries Use Radio

Radio is being used to help those found in trouble by Rev. G. M. Scott, an Australian clergyman, who is the leader of a party that is making a 24,000-mile missionary trip into isolated parts of Australia. The party carries wireless sending and receiving equipment. Whenever Rev. Scott finds settlers in need of immediate help he sends a radio message to headquarters of the Australian Mission, and assistance is sent by airplane.

Bermuda Imposes Duty On Potatoes

HAMILTON, Bermuda, Jan. 4.—Three days ago the House of Assembly adopted a resolution making the duty on Irish potatoes operative for the whole year instead of for ten months. It had been the custom to permit these potatoes free from Customs in October and November.

The change is for the protection of the Bermuda farmer, who it is claimed can if granted this protection raise within a few years all the potatoes the island requires. Seed potatoes properly certified would still be free from duty.

BUSINESS CONDITIONS IN ITALY

Greater activity is the marked feature of recent business conditions in Italy, writes A. B. Muddiman, Canadian Trade Commissioner in Milan in the forthcoming issue of the Commercial Intelligence Journal. The Government in the coming year is to pursue an energetic policy with the object of intensifying agricultural activity, some cities being granted subsidies for the reclamation and improvement of land. The wheat crop yield (6,123,500 tons) is about 16.7 per cent more than last year, notwithstanding the bad weather conditions that prevailed and the smaller areas planted. The textile industry has shown great activity both in cottons and wool. The automobile industry, which at the commencement of the year was facing difficulties in export markets and also owing to lesser local absorption, has shown a fair improvement. Before the war Canada used to import chiefly food products, especially pasta and the chief importation is textiles. The movement in Italy in favour of electrifying power is becoming more marked. There is a big increase in the import of pulp for the paper trade. In the chemical industry there has been a depression in the manufacture of inorganic acids and fertilizers, particularly phosphates. Owing to the activity in the shoe trade, the Italian leather industry has shown some improvement.

TWO ROCKEFELLER INSTITUTIONS UNITED

NEW YORK, Jan. 4.—Two philanthropic institutions, founded by John D. Rockefeller "to promote the well-being of mankind throughout the world" which have property with a value of more than \$233,000,000, and an actual far greater value were consolidated yesterday by permission of the supreme court. The institutions are the Rockefeller foundation organized in 1913 and the Laura Spellman Rockefeller memorial, founded in 1918, in memory of the oil magnate's wife.

Miss Wanda Wyatt Leaves On a Wonderful Trip

Miss Wanda Wyatt, daughter of Hon. J. E. and Mrs. Wyatt left on Saturday last for Montreal where she joined Mrs. George McSweeney, her aunt, whom she is accompanying on a world tour leaving New York on Jan. 7th.

The tour extends for six months and includes in its itinerary Paris, Bernice and Nice, the queen city of the Mediterranean; Gibraltar, Algiers, Naples and Mount Vesuvius, Athens—the city of statues and where is still intact the theatre where Sophocles and Euripides gave their dreams to the world; the Holy Land—Jerusalem, the Mount of Olives, Nazareth, Bethlehem, Getsemani, the Sea of Galilee, and other places rendered sacred by the footsteps of our Saviour.

In Egypt "the land of Joseph," they will visit Cairo, the Sphinx, the Pyramids and the renowned tomb of King "Tut"; then through the Suez Canal to French Somaliland in East Africa; Bombay in India, with its hanging gardens and "The Towers of Silence"; Delhi, the capital, and Calcutta; and Agra, which has in its said the most beautiful tomb in the world built by the Emperor Shah Jehan to contain the remains of his favorite queen, commenced in 1630 and completed at a cost of three million pounds sterling; Batavia—the sacred city of the Hindus on their sacred river, the Ganges; Thence to the Island of Ceylon; Rangoon in Burma, the centre of the Buddhist religion; and here also is the famous Buddhist Shrine "Shwe Dagon Pagoda."

Then on to Sumatra and the Danish East Indies; Singapore and Batavia; and the Philippines; then away to China, visiting Hong Kong, Shanghai and Peking, with its great wall built 2000 years B.C.; Formosa and Korea. Then on to Japan, "Marka Polo's land of gold,"—its inland Sea, Kobe, and Yokohama; Tokio and Mikko. Honolulu is their next stopping place, Hawaii and Fiji returning by way of San Francisco, Los Angeles, the Panama Canal, Havana and New York.

This is a great educational trip and it is to be hoped that Father Neptune and King Sol will deal gently with the tourists, so that they may fully enjoy the opportunities of the tour. Miss Wyatt is very fortunate in travelling with her aunt, as Mrs. McSweeney has been over a great part of the trip in former tours and it will be a valuable opportunity for Miss Wyatt to visit the places rendered famous in the ancient classics, studied by her in Arts Course at Old McGill.—S.

RAILWAY STATION WRECKED

PARIS, Jan. 4.—The handsome Bois de Boulogne railway station, which is used only by visiting heads of state and royalty was seriously damaged today by an explosion of an overcharge of dynamite used in demolishing the old fortifications nearby. The windows of the station and the main railway buildings around were shattered, the facade damaged and a large section of the roof destroyed by showers of masonry from the explosion. One woman was slightly hurt and taken to a hospital. The foreman directing the blasting took to flight and is being sought by the police.

A PARCHMENT AGED 284 YEARS

MONTREAL, Que., Jan. 4.—(By the Canadian Press.)—Out of a farm house near Berthier, Que., has come a yellowed parchment 284 years old, which is intriguing antiquarians here, who are trying to trace the travels that led an ancient land lease in the Channel Islands to the district of Montreal.

Channel Islanders came to New France in fair numbers, but most of them settled in the Gaspé region, and this is the first occasion upon which any clue to them has been found so far west in Quebec.

Written in old French, the deed was drawn on June 15, 1644, at St. Helier, Island of Jersey, before "Jean Dumaresq, gentleman, Lieut. Colonel George de Carlier and Esquire, captain of militia, controller of His Majesty's Royal Navigation, Bailiff in the Isle of Jersey." He, it is set forth, draws his authority from "His Sovereign Majesty Charles the First of that name, by the Grace of God, King of England, of Scotland, of Ireland, defender of the faith," etc.

In the deed one, Daniel Syveet leases two parcels of land, to one, Jean Hubert, for twelve bushels of wheat per annum, and there is a sub lease to Jacques Asplet and Jacques Francois Asplet.
