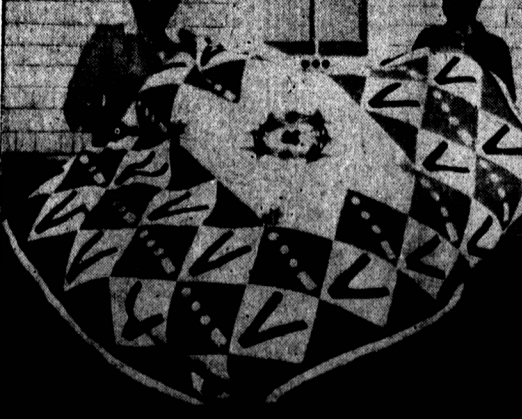

To Fix Drawings

How Can I !!

Q. How can I remove pitch from fabrics?
A. Pitch can often be removed from fabrics by rubbing with lard. Then scrape off as much pitch as possible and sponge with turpentine, rubbing gently until dry. Last, hang in the open air until all odor has disappeared.

Q. How can I prevent soft felt and fabric hats from soiling so quickly?
A. Rub over the surface frequently with a face cloth or rubber sponge, used only for this purpose and kept spotless and clean.

Q. How can I remedy an oil stain which produces a very strong odor of oil?
A. Try dropping a small piece of gum camphor into the tank. It will do away with much of the unpleasant odor.
