Miss Verna Watts spent the week-end at her home in York.





Left Wing Laborites May Be Disciplined

LONDON, April 19—(CP)—Some party affairs.

Left wing members of Parliament may be thrown out of the Labor Party because of a telegram of good wishes they sent to Italy's pro-Communist Socialists, a Labor Party spokesman said today.

One Independent, Socialist, and 37 Labor members are listed in a Rome dispatch as signatories of a telegram supporting pro-Communist Pietro Nenni's Socialists in the Italian election yesterday. Since then some of the members said their names were on the list by misunderstanding or without their knowledge. But a number stand by their guns.

The spokesman said Labor member John Platts-Mills "made a vague admission" that he sponsored the message.

The Daily Herald, organ of the Labor Party, called the incident an "escapade too dangerous to be ignored."

Another leftist member, Konni Zilliacus of Gateshead, was reported as a signer of the Nenni telegram.

The "rebels" represent left and right wings of the party in the Commons. They include perhaps 80 of the total of 395 Labor members and disputes are strictly within.

But the Nenni telegram has disturbed party strategists. The most urgent question is what shall be done with the members who defied administration policy and vent the message of support to Nenni. Athlee and his colleagues devoutly hope that the Communists would be given a severe setback in the Italian elections but the rebel group of backbenchers have wished the friends of Communism every success.

Col. Douglas Clifton Brown, Speaker of the Commons, accepted for debate a motion by 11 Labor members calling for the appointment of a special committee to investigate the affair.

However, Herbert Morrison, a House leader and chief Labor strategist, made this stern comment: "It is really a question of what is the most effective and appropriate way of dealing with it. But it is going to be dealt with effectively."

If the Commons approves the motion the special committee will act as a grand jury. It will determine whether the matter should be referred to the standing committee on parliamentary privilege, which has punitive powers.
