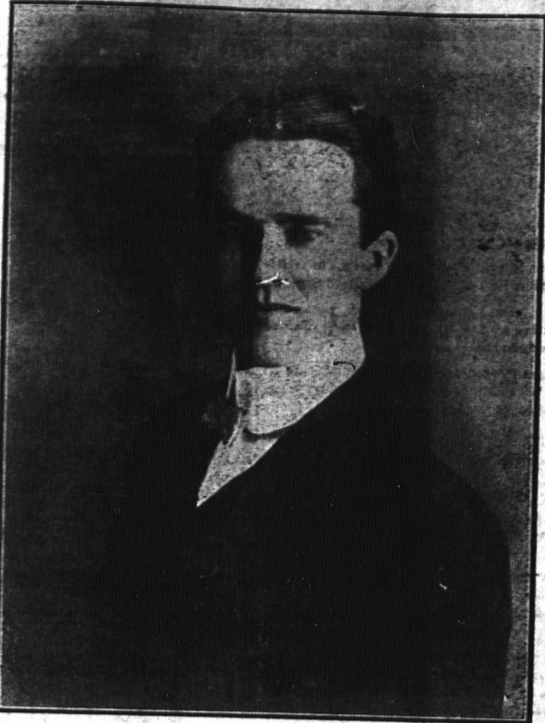

Britain's adhesion to the declaration of

synopsis of "Canadian North-West
HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS."
ANY enumerated section of Dominion
Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and
Alberta, containing 80 and 160 acres,
may be homesteaded by any person who is the
sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years
of age, to the extent of one-quarter section
acres, more or less.
Entry must be made, personally at the local
office for the district in which the land
is situated.
The homesteader is required to perform the
conditions connected therewith under one of
the following plans.
(1) At least six months' residence upon and
cultivation of the land in each year for three
years.
(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is
deceased) of the homesteader resides upon a
farm in the vicinity of the land entered for
the requirements as to residence may be satis-
fied by such person residing with the father
or mother.
(3) If the settler has his permanent resi-
dence upon farming land owned by him in the
vicinity of his homestead, the requirements as
to residence may be satisfied by residence
upon the said land.
Six months' notice in writing should be given
the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at
St. James of intention to apply for natural-
ization.
