Late Market News

(Canadian Press)

OTTAWA, Dec. 4.—A few more fresh eggs are arriving with an easier tone on the Canadian egg markets today. Toronto—More fresh eggs are arriving in this market. Brokers are asking extras 57, firsts 52, pullet extras 45, seconds 30, delivered. Dealers are quoting country shippers for ungraded eggs extras 55, firsts 48, pullet extras 40, seconds 29, delivered. Wholesalers' quotations of fresh eggs are extras loose 62, firsts 58, pullet extras 52, seconds 33 to 35. Some dressed poultry has arrived costing delivered, turkeys 24 1-2, chicken 21, fowl 20. All grades are at a flat price. Montreal—Egg receipts here today were 776 cases as compared to 756 cases on the corresponding day last year. This egg market is firm on fresh extras, but steady on firsts and pullet extras. Buyers are very cautious purchasing small lots to cover their daily needs. St. John—Receipts of fresh eggs are still scarce on this market showing little or no increase and prices are unchanged. Wholesalers are quoting retailers extras 65 to 68, firsts 60 to 62, seconds 40. Price of storage eggs to wholesalers are unsettled. Wholesalers are quoting retailers extras 40, firsts 38, seconds 32. Considerable uncertainty is prevailing regarding the turkey deal and no prices have been set yet. The Christmas trading supplies appear about the same as last year, with the quality better. Halifax—Receipts of local fresh eggs are increasing on this market with a good percentage of arrivals grading extras, and these are being rapidly absorbed by the trade. Storage eggs are moving fairly well, but at much lower price levels, owing to large quantities of Upper Canada eggs shipped to this market at lower prices than local dealers can meet and break even on their holdings. Dealers are quoting country shippers for fresh eggs delivered extras 55 to 60, firsts 45 to 50, pullet extras 35 to 40, seconds 30 to 34. Prices of fresh eggs to retailers are extras 70 to 75, firsts 65 to 68, pullet extras 55 to 60, seconds 45 to 50. Poultry receipts are heavy and the quality is good. Dealers are expecting very low prices for the holiday season and are having difficulty in placing sales at any set price. Chicago spot 27, December 16 3-4, January 16 1-8.
