S' side Trade Board discusses Transportation

Large Increase in Motor Traffic To Province Revealed by Mr. B. Graham Rogers.

At an important meeting of the Summerside Board of Trade, Monday night, presided over by the Mayor, Mr. B. Graham Rogers, transportation and tourist matters were thoroughly discussed. Mr. B. W. Robinson gave a very comprehensive review of the motor traffic in Charlottetown some few days ago, with high road officials and short addresses were also delivered by Messrs. H. B. Rogers, H. R. Allen, J. F. Arsenault, J. W. Read, C. R. Rogers, S. G. Merriam, W. M. Bruce and others. The opinion of all speakers was that additional facilities must be provided without delay to take care of the growing freight, passenger and automobile traffic. Business of all kinds to the Island and from the Island is increasing. After the discussion, the Transportation Committee authorized to take the matter up further with the proper authorities.

NAZIS CLAIM

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difficult sort of street fighting. (Moscow acknowledged the Germans had made considerable gains in a number of points, but said the Nazi advances had been made at the expense of immense casualties.) The German air force was said to be striking at Russian communications and the Nazis claimed it had made a two-day attack on Smolensk, railway centre 200 miles east of Minsk on the main road to Moscow. In the south the Germans claimed their air force had interrupted traffic on the railway between Odessa, Black Sea port, and Tarnopol in the Ukraine. There was no confirmation of any of these reports. The Germans also claimed to have bombed Murmansk, Russia's major Arctic port. The Nazis also claimed that Red troops were in flight eastward on both sides of Lwow, and that an unestimated number of Soviet divisions were surrounded behind the town itself. Russian forces surrounded between Bialystok and Minsk had the protection of heavy forts, German radio reporters said. In order to win ground and close the jaws of the trap, German infantry stormed the Russians repeatedly but just as they had lighted off counter-attacks, the reporters said.

Narvik, Norway, his organization of English defences, and his long career in India. But he has long been an advocate of the new defensive warfare involving mobile, two-day, tank units. Evidence that Mr. Churchill and his advisers consider the Middle Eastern command all the more vital now that Germany is marching into Russia was seen in the simultaneous appointment of Capt. Oliver Lyttelton as Minister of State and member of the war cabinet to represent the cabinet in the Middle East. Capt. Lyttelton relinquished his post as president of the Board of Trade on Sunday. He is expected to co-ordinate diplomatic and military activities and will deal with such problems as publicity, information, financial and economic warfare, disposal of prisoners, administration of territory seized from the enemy and relations with the Free French administration and also with the Emperor of Ethiopia.
