Stock Markets At A Glance

CHICAGO, Nov. 15 (AP) - Wheat was strong but other grain futures markets were unsettled today, rallying after an opening break only to fluctuate over a fairly wide range the remainder of the session.

NEW YORK, Nov. 15 (AP) - Carry over selling hit stocks at the opening today but after the first hour the market's resistance improved and some minor recoveries were registered. Closing prices were irregular.

Rails stiffened near the close but here as elsewhere the gains were generally narrow. Best improvement was shown by such stocks as Boeing and Allied Chemical, up a point or so. Fractional advances were registered by Woolworth, Douglas Aircraft, Western Union, Johns-Manville, Texas Co., New York Central, Pennsylvania and Southern Pacific.

TORONTO, Nov. 15 (CP) - Trading volume declined and prices closed down in all groups today on the Toronto Stock Market. The golds with a drop of 58 led the decline. Steels held steady but for losses of 1-2 for McIntyre and Lake Shore. Losses of 20 cents came out for Buffalo-Arkerite, Queenston and Giant Yellowknife, other golds weakening about 5 cents including Chesterville, Fairmount, Perron, Pickle Crow, Pioneer, Powell Rouyn San Antonio, Teck Hughes and Wright-Hamreaves.

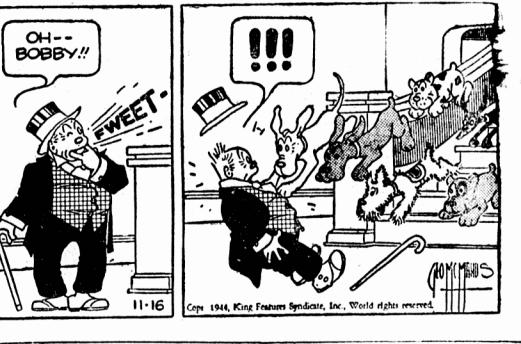
