Former Islander Amateur Telescope Maker



The following item, in part, taken from a recent Portland, Oregon newspaper will be of interest to many in this province: "There are quite a number of Amateur Telescope Makers and Observers in Portland and many have spent long hours in making really fine instruments with which they scan the heavens whenever the skies are clear. Portland has two large telescopes of note, a third is almost ready and a fourth is being mounted. The Number One telescope in Oregon and probably in the entire Pacific Northwest is a 20-inch reflector at the home of A. E. Macintosh, 4214 SW Arthur Way. This instrument has been created from one of the test mirrors used in determining construction of the 200-inch Mount Palomar telescope. The public is welcome to use it without charge."

The Mr. A. Everett Macintosh referred to was born in Victoria, B.C. A picture above is the observatory which houses the Number One telescope.—S.

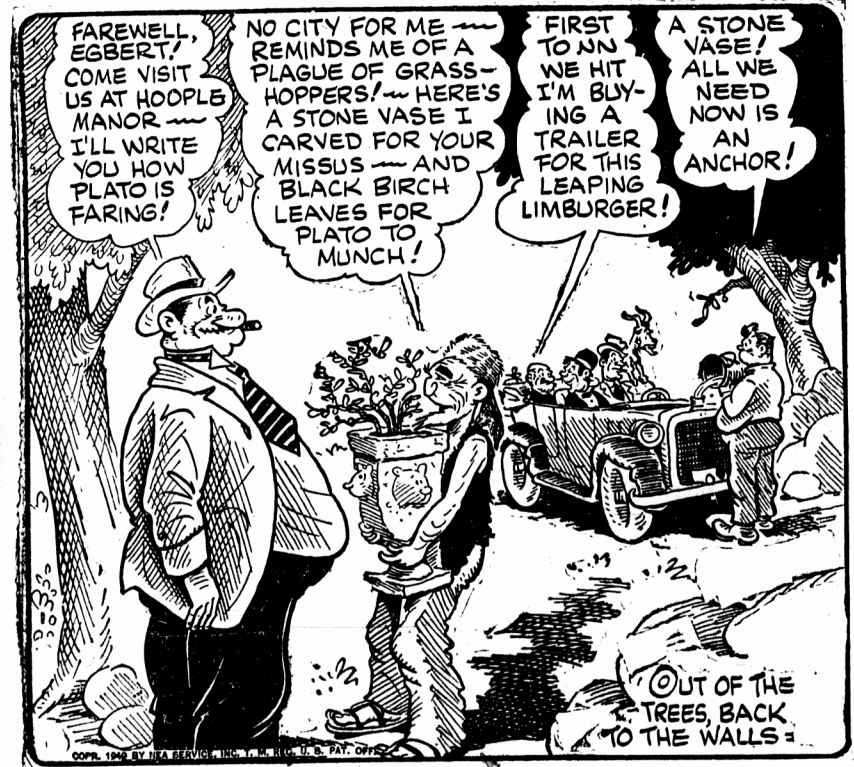
