Rock City Tobacco Company Make First Bid

QUEBEC, Nov. 20—An unusual feature of the first tobacco sales under the new Marketing Act in Norfolk County was the opening bid by an agent of the Rock City Tobacco Company who purchased the first crop at a price of 33c a pound, 4c higher than the appraisal. This is said to be the first time in years that an independent company has opened the market and growers were pleased that the first sale brought a price higher than the appraisal for the best crops. The Rock City bid was also indicative of the determination of the company's buying agents to secure the finest quality tobaccos by offering a premium price. The tobacco trade here and in the United States expressed interest in the fact that the Rock City agents made the opening bid. That company has enjoyed increasing sales in the Dominion through growing popularity of its principal brands, Master Mason pipe tobacco, Master Mason, Tucker and the "menthol cooled" Spud cigarettes. Sales last week were the first supervised by the Tobacco Marketing Board and growers praised the new system.
