

DEATH LIST IS NOW THIRTY-SEVEN.
 LONG BEACH, Cal., May 26—Evidence to be presented Thursday at the inquest over the 37 persons who lost their lives in the collapse Saturday of a portion of the Municipal pier will be heard directly upon the question of who was responsible for the condition of the structure which proved too weak to withstand the weight of several thousand men, women and children, who had gathered to celebrate the birth anniversary of Queen Victoria.
 While the seriously hurt numbered

not more than 55, nearly two hundred were injured so that aid will be given them.
 Rev. I. B. Kilborne, aged 84, one of the injured, died this afternoon. This brings the total number of dead up to thirty-seven.
 James Pwomey, City Building Inspector, said today that the vibrations, caused by the Empire Day parade marching on the pier were responsible for the collapse.
 "An expert inspection just before the disaster," he added, "would have failed to disclose that anything was wrong with the pier."
