THE FIGHT GOES ON.

The fight against the liquor traffic goes briskly these days. In almost every Province of Canada there has been within the past few months a temperance revival. It has been fruitful in Ontario, placing many scores of municipalities under the local option, no license by laws. In Quebec the "dry" area in which no licenses are granted is being steadily extended. In Montreal Archbishop Bruchesi is pushing forward a great temperance work among his coreligionists and French-speaking compatriots. In Nova Scotia the Murray Government has been strongly urged to adopt the principle of prohibition, which the Conservative party has made a plank in its platform. The Premier has promised to definitely announce the policy of the Government during the current session of the Legislature. In the meantime the temperance people are renewing their efforts for the enforcement of the Scott Act in several counties. Amherst town we are told is likely to be very "dry" in the future. Ex-Mayor Lowther, who during his term as Mayor vigorously enforced the Act, has been appointed inspector, and this is looked upon as a signal victory for the temperance party.

In New Brunswick there is a preponderance of prohibition sentiment in the country districts especially, while in St. John, the stronghold of the liquor traffic in the Province, there are strong and active temperance forces. Vigorous efforts are from time to time made to punish the violators of the Scott Act in Fredericton and Moncton where the Act is in force. And the Government of the Province has introduced legislation of a stringent sort to prevent the shipment of liquor from St. John and other license centres into the Scott Act counties and cities. In this the Government stands pledged to go as far as their legislative powers enable them to go. We all know what is doing in this Province in the way of extending our excellent Prohibitory Law to the entire Province. The Island proudly leads the van of the prohibition movement in Canada. It occupies the post of highest honor in the van of the arms of reform. Here, the liquor traffic is more utterly discredited than in any other Province of Canada, if not in the whole Empire. It has never had a standing in morals or reason anywhere, its sole support being in the greed of gain on the part of the brewer, the distiller and the publican and a pernicious appetite on the part of their customers. So the great fight goes on with Island prohibitionists leading the temperance hosts of Canada.

It is sometimes stated that liquor prohibition in Prince Edward Island is against the tourist business, but this statement takes no account of the number who come to our shores for the purpose of breaking off bad habits and associations by taking a ride "on the water wagon". If once we could make prohibition absolute the result might be to increase tourist travel in this direction tenfold in both the summer and winter months. This we cannot do while the Dominion keeps our ports open to the importation of liquor, which the Province cannot prevent. We see no reason, however why the federal Parliament might not prohibit both the manufacture and importation of liquor in any Province where the people through their Legislature express the desire to have the liquor traffic abolished. If that were done we should have a fair means of testing the effect of prohibition on the tourist business, and The Guardian would have no fear of the result.
