Synopsis of Canadian North West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of a valuable tract of land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land, each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$100 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$3000. A homesteader who has exhausted his home stead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$100 per acre.
