MORDELL, Man., March 28.—William Dyck, who carried away in his automobile the Plum Coulee bank robber and murderer of H. M. Arnold, today told the witness stand the story of his fear-compelled drive with the bandit. He told of meeting John Kratchenko, the prisoner now charged with the robbery and murder, the night before the crime, and said Kratchenko had compelled him at the revolver's end to promise to drive a friend of Kratchenko's who had got into trouble with the police away from Plum Coulee the next day.

Kratchenko said his friend would come from the Queens Hotel, would be dressed in a black coat and wear a beard, and in fact would look like an old Jew. Dyck was to drive him away immediately he got into the car.

The next day a man dressed as described by Kratchenko jumped in the car and pointing his revolver at Dyck forced him to drive away. Dyck sped up his car, the "man in black" was loaded down with bundles of bills and two bags of silver. He took off his beard, when they cleared the town, and witness recognized him as Kratchenko.

COLORED WIGS GAIN FAVOR

FRANCE, March 26.—Colored wigs at the end of the year were shown only timidly at the theatres or dancing palaces in Paris. Already classed among fantasies of a mode bizarre, but brilliant, they are now spoken of with indulgence. Various shades, not the least sought ones, have admitted them. They were in evidence at the recent of the Duchess d'Uzes.

The fashion promises to outlast many others, because its necessary exclusiveness is secured first, by its cost, and second, by the limited number of coiffeurs able adequately to arrange it.

Colored wigs are worn only at night. It was thought at first practicable to use silk, but it proved too soft and intractable, and is now used only to obtain shades of difficult gold and silver, which would be very expensive otherwise.

Generally real hair is used—Chinese especially, as it is cheaper than that of the Occidental races.
