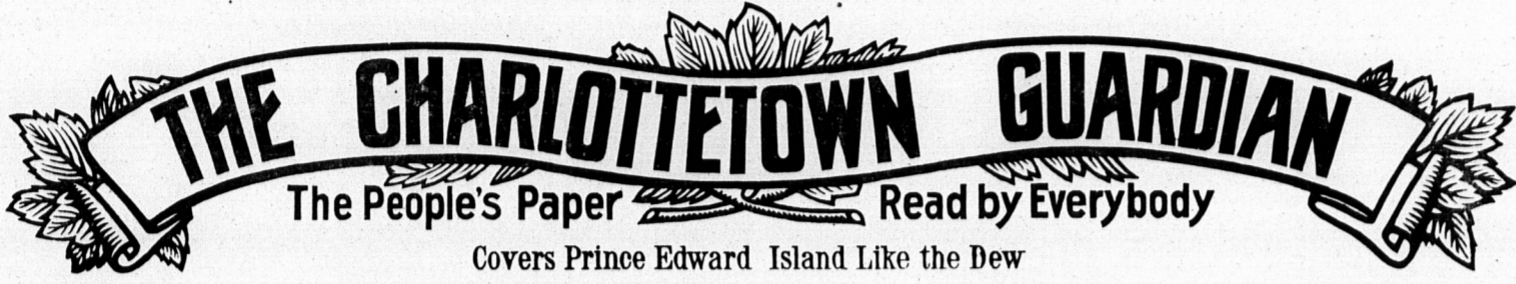

VICTORIA, Brazil, Aug. 7.—(AP)—A new sea battle between the British auxiliary cruiser Alcantara and a German raider—both already battle scarred—was believed to have been fought today off the South American coast.

The reported resumption of their running engagement for a second time within two weeks was believed indicated by loud explosions at sea and a radio message to a Government station saying two armed ships were sighted off the Brazilian coast.

The Alcantara left Rio de Janeiro, 300 miles southwest of Victoria, Monday after four days of repairs required after its sea-fight with an unidentified raider July 28.

The raider also was reported to have been hit during the fight and there was speculation that it might have met the Alcantara coming from port while heading ashore to have its own damage repaired.

The radio message that two armed ships were seen was received by the local government radio station. It said the message came from the 4,872-ton Brazilian passenger ship, Ararangua.
