Ridgings In Hogs

With the profitable marketing of Canadian hogs dependent on the reputation of the product with the consumer both in Great Britain and at home, great care must be exercised to overcome any factor which may injure this reputation. Any objectionable characteristic in the product, especially in flavor and aroma, may have far reaching results when it reaches the table of the consumer. The factors which have the greatest possibilities to damage the name of Canadian bacon are:

- 1. Fishy taste and odour
2. Sexual odour.
During recent years many farmers have been feeding cabin, cod fish offal and even lobster bodies in order to supply the protein necessary in a balanced ration. This practice is very economical and commendable but when such feeds are used great care must be taken to prevent the fish flavour and odour from tainting the finished product. At the present time a noticeable percentage of the hogs reaching Maritime packing plants carry this objectionable flavour. This difficulty is the increasing number of ridgings or blind hogs during the last month of feeding. This does not apply to the produce of high grade fish meal, but in fat. Low grade fish meal should be fed with care.

"Smoked Eel" Makes Bid For Market

Faced with the necessity of establishing new markets due to the loss of overseas business brought about by disturbed world conditions the province of Quebec with a yearly production of some 20,000 hundredweights of eels is giving attention to new methods of preparation of these fish.

The demand for fresh and frozen eel in Canada and the United States is limited. Smoked and canned eel, however, is favoured with a greater demand and it is believed there is a possibility of greatly increasing the market for these products.

Prior to smoking, the eel is eviscerated, skinned, salted in concentrated brine for one-half hour and allowed to drain for 24 hours. The smoking is done in a smoke house of "type B," as designed by the Fisheries Research Board of Canada. The smoke box for eel smoking is made of terra-cotta and the inlet and outlet trunkways are made of sheet iron. The only modification brought about is the installation of a pipe 2 feet long and 8 inches in diameter between the fan and the smoke producer. This pipe is equipped with a damper and serves to lodge a heating system. The heating system might be a 6 to 8 kilowatt electric heater, but a flame of a large gasoline torch burner wrapped in gold coloured eelphane and kept in a cool place.

Make-up that is so disarmingly natural that it never occurs to anyone to think of it as make-up at all.

Most any woman can have a lovely skin for the skin responds to treatment and blossoms when it is cared for. But she must first understand the nature of her particular type of skin.
