Lloyd George Speaks in Wales

WILMEL, Wales, Jan. 24.—(CP)—The United Kingdom tonight witnessed a gesture of David Lloyd George in which he held out what was considered a significant hand of welcome to George Lansbury, Premier and leader of the British Labor Party.

In a speech to his own people of Wales the 72-year-old war-time Premier hit back at critics of the new deal plan he launched Thursday and indicated confidence in the Labor chief.

Mr. Lloyd George spoke in Welsh to an audience of his countrymen, lapsing into English only occasionally to enforce his argument with some familiar phrase, he made no attempt to repeat the points of his address in both languages as bilingual speakers in the province of Quebec often do.

Want Year Moratorium On Duck Shooting

(C.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) NEW YORK, Jan. 23.—Landing game to the bow-legged girl—ways sympathized with but never invited to the picnic—J.N. ("Ding") Smith, chief of the U.S. Biological Survey, today made an appeal before the 21st American Game Conference for a national policy for the conservation of wild life resources.

The former newspaper cartoonist was one of a score of speakers who participated in a session featured by the proposal of the National Association of Audubon Societies for a one-year moratorium on duck shooting in the United States, commencing September, 1936.

A group from the Cape Cod section recommended a three-point plan. They said they would subscribe to the moratorium if sportsmen in Canada and Mexico also agreed, if federal funds were applied to enforce the measure and if all baiting of waterfowl, excepting of natural feed, were forbidden.

"I am only a civil servant of Canada," I shall probably make a recommendation to my government on the matter but what I shall say is not for me to say at this time. The first consideration will be the preservation of a safe margin of population among the ducks, I assure you."

The duck situation in Canada was covered comprehensively by Lloyd. "May I say to the vast number of people who are interested for various reasons in the waterfowl supply of the continent," said Lloyd, "that there is little that is cheering in the 1934 reports from Canada, and much that, to say the least, is disturbing."

In the Prairie Provinces of Canada, the nesting ground for the bulk of the waterfowl, conditions during the 1934 breeding season were unfavorable. Precipitation was below normal and many small water areas near which nesting had begun disappeared.
