SOME PROPOSED NEW STATES.

Although a new Congress was elected in November last it is the old Congress which was elected years ago which was recently called together and will deal with many important matters in the months to come. This seems a strange anomaly to Canadians who are accustomed to a practice in which one Parliament must be dissolved and cease to exist before another can be elected. But the system in vogue in the United States is much less quickly responsive to the public will than is that of British countries. Among the questions which the moribund Congress will be called to deal is the important one of granting or refusing statehood to the three Territories of Oklahoma, New Mexico and Arizona. If raised to the dignity of States each of these Territories would become entitled to representation by two members in the national Senate, and in the House of Representatives by a number of members proportionate to their population.

And just here the matter of party politics comes in as it seems to be conceded that New Mexico and Arizona are strongly Democratic in complexion. Oklahoma is probably Republican, and therefore more likely to obtain its admission from a Congress which is under Republican control. The population of New Mexico is not over 200,000 of whom 144,000 are native Mexicans speaking Spanish. The balance is largely made up of other foreign nationalities, so that there are but comparatively few who speak English. Arizona has a larger population of Americans, but by the latest census had but 125,000 people, planted upon an equal number of square miles. It has mineral wealth, but little arable land. The people of these two Territories have no particular desire for statehood, and the moving cause for their proposed advancement lies in the desire of outside capitalists who are interested in mines or railway ventures which they could exploit more profitably were there state legislatures in existence. These capitalists and the Democratic desire to increase the party representation in the Senate are evidently more powerful factors in determining the

question than is the will of the people most concerned.

A patient at the John Hopkins Hospital Baltimore is said by the physicians here to be suffering from a disease which has, as far as records go, only once before appeared. The disease is known as ankylostoma, or "lary disease," and acquires its name from the fact that the most striking visible symptom is an increasing disinclination for physical exertion of any kind and the most extreme lassitude. The authorities at the hospital refuse to divulge the name of the patient under treatment, and stated that a brother of the patient recently died from a similar disease. Guided by the facts furnished by a post mortem examination in the former case, Superintendent Hurd, of the hospital, states that the patient will recover. The only other case is reported in the John Hopkins Hospital Bulletin, December, 1901, and was that of an English sailor, who was sent to Bayview Asylum from a vessel which had recently arrived in port from a Southern voyage. He was supposed to be suffering from anaemia, and continued to sink until he died on the eighteenth day after his admission. A post-mortem examination by the same physicians at the John Hopkins Hospital, made at the request of the Bayview authorities, revealed the fact that many thousands of infinitesimal parasites were actively at work boring into the mucous membrane of the intestines and causing a loss of blood, with resultant lassitude and inertia, and finally producing death. These parasites, according to the statement of Dr. Hurd, are especially abundant in certain sections of the Carolinas and Georgia, and the disease is prevalent among what are known as the "clay eaters" of that region.
