Hornets Earn Close Victory Over Royals

Carrying a sting in every period Milton Hornets last night ushered in the local hockey season by out-scoring the Hunter River Royals 4-3 in a fast hockey match at the Forum.

Looking like easy victors as they piled up a 3-0 lead before the half-way mark of the second period Hornets had to produce their best before subduing their opponents.

In a fast first period Bill Aylward who used to pasture for intermediate and senior Abbies teams put the Hornets one-up as he took a pass from Andrews at the two minute mark to send his team in front.

But here the tide of the game changed. Two goals from the stick of V. Noy on passes from Stevenson and Sinclair put the Royals back in the running and when R. Stevenson scored the equalizer early in the final canto Hunter River rotors visualized a victory.

But it wasn't to be so. As the seconds of the final minutes of the game ticked off Aylward again carried the torch for the Hornets. Snaring the disc at center ice the big Milton winger sped in fast, eluding two hard-driving defencemen, Bill coasted in close to beat the sensational Royal goalie with a back-hand drive and the goal spelt victory.

Quebec Hockey Association Suspended By C.A.H.A.

OTTAWA, Dec. 8.—(OP)—President Cecil Duncan of the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association said tonight he had suspended the Quebec Amateur Hockey Association from the Dominion body and that a commission would be set up to control hockey in the province.

Duncan suspended the Quebec body after having been shown press reports from Montreal, stating three decisions of the C. A. H. A. had been disregarded by the branch. Contrary to Duncan's orders, Don Wilson and Cy Allen were given permission tonight to play in all future games of the Quebec senior hockey league.

"I am exercising the authority given me under the constitution of the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association, and have suspended this branch from membership in the association," said Duncan in a statement issued at his home, where he has been confined for a week with illness.

he intended to place a resolution before the Quebec body calling for a breakaway from the Dominion Association.

The Secretary-Registrar also was the seconder of a resolution at tonight's Q. A. H. A. meeting that hastened the open breach between the parent and affiliate.

By the resolution, the Quebec group defied the C. A. H. A. in granting permission to two Ontario players to stay with Montreal teams "regardless of any decision by the C. A. H. A."

The decision to allow players to remain in the Quebec Senior Hockey League apparently widened a split that has been developing between the provincial association and its parent body for the last few weeks.

Controversy in the Wilson-Allen case developed over their eligibility to play in the Q. S. H. L. without transfers. Allen, a centre, is claimed by Toronto Goodyears, and Kirkland Lake asserts ownership of Wilson.

A centre also, Wilson played lacrosse with Orillia Terrers last year, and spent the last two winters at hockey in Europe. Now he is with the suburban Verdun Maple Leafs, and the Leafs declare the fact of his European play eliminates the need for a transfer.

Both men, the club state, were here in time to qualify for play under the residence rule. They were told by Q. A. H. A. president Art Lapierre that they could remain in the Q. S. H. L. despite the fact the C. A. H. A. frowned on the move, and tonight the provincial association backed up its head.
