Jury Disagrees In Trial Of Andrew Perry

A petit jury at Summerside disagreed yesterday in the case of Andrew Perry, charged with conspiracy to distill alcoholic liquor illegally. There were ten for conviction and two for acquittal. The jury retired at five o'clock and court recessed till 7:30 at which time the jury returned for instructions.

The court asked them to take some more time and endeavor to reach a unanimous decision. They finally came back at 8:30 and said they were unable to reach a verdict.

Mr. Hughes, for the prosecution, made a motion that the jury be polled.

This was objected to by the defence but after considerable legal argument the court allowed it.

Earlier in the day the jury had been addressed by Mr. Hughes for the prosecution and Mr. McNaught for the defence. Chief Justice Thane A. Campbell was presiding judge. Counsel for the defence J. Watson MacNaught, K. C. and W. H. Noonan.

The jury members were: Colin Stewart, Kenneth, John, George, S. McKenna, Horace Lidstone, Fred J. Barrett, James Tuplin, Edmond Arsenault, William LeDane, Earl Hickey, Ralph Dodds, Harrison Bell, and J. Bruce Paynter.

Court adjourned till this morning when sentence will be imposed on Charles Perry, who pleaded guilty earlier in the week to having wash on his premises.

Judgment In Northumberland Ferries Case

The following despatch is in line with a news item published in yesterday's Guardian:

OTTAWA, Nov. 25 (C.P.) - Northumberland Ferries Ltd., of Charlottetown, was awarded \$128,336 and costs in its claim against the crown for compensation for war purposes of two vessels, under an Exchequer Court judgment made public today.

The company claimed \$175,000 for the motor vessel Seaport and the Dunsmuir and \$300,000 for the steamship Bankav, taken over by the Crown for naval service during the war.

Mr. Justice E. H. Angers held the company was entitled to \$128,336 and costs. He also ruled the company, upon giving the crown valid title to the vessels, was to be paid interest at five per cent from March 1, 1941, to date of judgment.

(Continued from page 1.) sighted in early evening. Under a barrage of fire from Iroquois gunners they made their run over the merchantman and scored a direct hit. The order to abandon ship was given.

Iroquois immediately got her boats away with Lieut. W. L. Hayes in command. Hayes, in charge of the cutter, which directed Iroquois to the destroyer in the water. It was from the cutter, too, that Grant swam.

"I was bowman in Lieut. Hayes' boat," he told an interviewer. "I made a lifetime last around my middle and whenever I saw someone in need of help I swam out and helped him."

Spence was at action stations at half a mile away became enveloped in flames. "Shortly after they abandoned ship I saw a yellow flare but I sank before we could get to him," said Spence. "Then I heard another yellow flare for help. I slipped off my rig and, securing a heaving line, went in off the bow. The yellow was 100 yards away, but I reached his side and hooked my arms around him, hooking him back to the scramble net."

Spence made several other trips. Just as he considered his job ended he saw a form float by in the moonlight. Overboard he went again and brought back a man in very bad shape, but he recovered.
