THE LAYMEN'S MOVEMENT.

The apostolic commission was to go into all the world and preach the Gospel. To that end the Christian church has been always a missionary church, and home and foreign missions have been important fields of religious activity. This branch of work for the evangelisation of the world has been voluntary and lacking somewhat in the system, something too in the energy with which the great business enterprises of the world are carried on.

A new movement sprang up in New York a few years ago, when a small number of devout laymen had assembled to celebrate the centennial of the Hay Stack Prayer Meeting of a hundred years before. These men concluded that not half as much had been done or was doing, as ought to have been done and to be now going on to evangelise the world. They set out to find out what was wrong and how it could be righted. That in effect was the inception and the basis of the Laymen's Movement.

The platform of the movement provides for an independent investigation of foreign sessions by laymen, and for an intelligent and business-like knowledge and administration of the resources of the church in order that it may better fulfill its great work in the world. This is being carried out and is proving effective in creating new interest in and sympathy for mission work and largely increased contributions to its needs as thus intelligently and methodically disclosed.

From the United States the Laymen's movement has spread to Canada and is making its influence felt to the ends of the world. Already the contributions to missions have been by this agency increased in various Canadian cities and localities, two, three and in some cases five fold, thus demonstrating how great are the yet unexploited resources of the church and of civilization for the betterment of those hundreds of millions of Asia, Africa and the islands of the Sea who are yet in heathen darkness.

A delegation will be in our city within the next few days for the purpose of extending the Laymen's Movement in this Province and there is little doubt that good will come of it. Just to show what has been accomplished in the first year of the movement in Canada it may be mentioned that the contributions for mission work have been increased in some Canadian cities as shown below:

St. John will this year enforce the income tax against Dominion officials. Should the latter win their appeal to the Privy Council, the income tax paid to the city in the mean time by the federal officials will be repaid them with interest. This seems to be a fair arrangement.

Over in Westmoreland, B. the saloon men have done upon a still hunt while the temperance people, as usual will hold meetings and conduct a platform campaign preparatory to the Scott Act elections. We do not anticipate a majority adverse to the Act. The hopes of the repeaters are apparently based upon the new population in Moncton and the use of money and liquor as corrupting agencies. The fight bids fair to be a strenuous one and there is much at stake.

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont., Dec. 6.—Suffering from foot and mouth disease, over one hundred and fifty cattle are being destroyed on the Jacob Dold stock farm, just outside Niagara Falls, N. Y., one of the largest stock farms in the district. At six o'clock last night about fifty head had been killed and the slaughter will continue all day. A trench one hundred and seventy-five feet long and ten feet wide has been dug, and the cows are buried as soon as killed and covered with quicklime. This is the largest slaughter of diseased cattle since the quarantine was established.

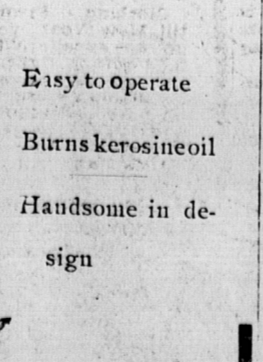
