WELCOME SIGNS

Canada's imports from the United States were \$2,246,000 higher in September than in the same month last year, but exports to the States were \$6,470,000 better. This is hailed by the Toronto Globe (Liberal) as an encouraging sign.

CANADA'S STABILITY

In the news of this date thirty years ago we read that when the Dominion Government placed a loan in London for the comparatively small sum of a million pounds it was necessary to have the Imperial guarantee.

It was the beginning of a new era in Canadian finance. A second War Loan, issued in 1916, asked for 100 millions. A total of 34,000 subscribers came forward with 200 million dollars.

A fifth War Loan, and the second Victory Loan, came in 1918, asked for 300 millions. The answer was more than one million subscriptions, with a total of 600 million dollars, or more than seventy-five dollars per head of population.

eighty dollars per head of the population. Putting this record in another way, the Government on those six occasions asked for a total of \$1,050,000,000, received from the nation \$2,066,000,000. The truth is there has never been a failure of a Canadian domestic loan.

A domestic loan, apart from all other considerations, has obvious advantages. There is the chief advantage that the interest paid on a domestic issue is paid to our own citizens.

EGG GRADING

Canada is the largest per capita egg consuming country in the world, one reason given by the Department of Agriculture at Ottawa being that confidence has been established in the consumer through the grading of eggs.

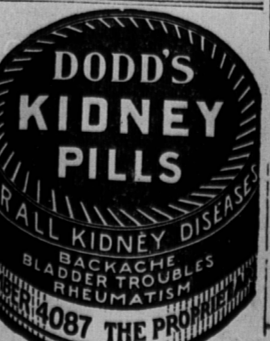

The Wandering "Schools"

(Canada Week-by-Week)

Officials of the Canadian Department of Fisheries are wondering where are the schools of plicards this year. The usual "schools" that frequent the waters off the coast of British Columbia in July are missing.

Ordinarily the plicards strike in off Vancouver Island, B.C., in abundant quantities in July and make brisk work for seine boat fishermen, workers in plants producing several canneries, but this year the fish haven't appeared except in very small numbers, or, at all events, up to a short time ago the big schools had not shown up.

When the fish did not appear at the beginning of the season in early July, seine boat crews scoured the seas off the west coast of Vancouver Island where plicards are ordinarily present in greatest abundance during the Summer, but they searched without success.

The plicard fishery is normally one of the "big four" among Canada's Pacific coast fisheries, the others being the salmon, halibut, and herring fisheries.

Talked Himself Safe

(W.W.C. in the New Statesman and Nation, London) The first time I heard the name of Adolf Hitler mentioned was shortly after the end of the war, when a man named Frans Xavier Huber, a war veteran, who had lost a leg before Verdun in 1917, told me stories of a curious fellow who had been in his regiment at the front.

The thing that had struck him about Private Hitler was his grandiloquence. He was neither popular nor the reverse with his fellows; they just smiled at him and his vague, rambling speeches on everything in the world and out of it. He acquired very swiftly the reputation of being what in the British Army is called "an old soldier."

He interested himself particularly in the important question of seeing that the officers' washing was done or doing it himself. This secured for him the good graces of the colonel who removed him from the more constant dangers of the trenches and appointed him runner between regimental headquarters and the front line.

Though he got the Iron Cross of the second class, no one in the regiment ever looked upon Hitler as any sort of a hero; indeed, they rather admired him for the skill with which he avoided hot corners.

FLYING INSECT HUNTERS

Officers of the Dominion Entomological Branch have learned how to dust forests by airplane for the extermination of forest insect pests, and when financial conditions become more favourable, airplane dusting may be employed to protect the most valuable stands of timber.

It is called the "Consorting With Criminals Act" according to Melbourne advices to the Australian Press Bureau (San Francisco), and under it convicted criminals are liable to arrest and imprisonment if they are ever seen together.
