FORMER HUSBAND OF DUCHESS OF WINDSOR WEDS

LONDON, Aug. 23 — The marriage of Ernest Aldrich Simpson, former husband of the Duchess of Windsor, to Mrs. Avril Joy Leveson Gower, 36, socially prominent sportswoman, was announced today.

An unobtrusive, five-line item on the society page of The Times said the marriage took place Aug. 12 and "Mr. and Mrs. Simpson will be in residence at 11 Upper Phillimore Gardens after September 10."

The Times made no other mention of the ceremony and it was not until mid-afternoon that other newspaper editors awoke to the story and splashed it on front pages.

A young woman who received telephone calls at Simpson's office refused to say anything about the reported marriage. "I simply am not talking," she told newspaper men.

The London Star said the marriage was Simpson's fourth and the third for Mrs. Gower, whose last husband was Brig. Hugh Nugent Leveson Gower, company director and member of a cricket-playing family.

The Duchess of Windsor, the former Wallis Warfield Simpson, was Simpson's second wife.

The Star said the new Mrs. Simpson's first husband, whom she married in 1921, was a Russian. Her marriage to Leveson Gower was dissolved three months ago, the newspaper reported.

None of the accounts of the marriage said where the ceremony was performed.

Simpson, son of a British father and an American mother, served with the Goldstream Guards before entering his father's firm of ship charterers in London. He is 51.

The bride's father was the late Sir John Wilkins, a stockbroker, who gave her a £4,000 (\$16,000) a year income and a Park Lane flat when she married the Russian prince.

Simpson's first wife was Dorothy Parson, member of a New England family. His second was Mrs. Wallis Spencer, the present Duchess of Windsor for whose divorce King Edward abdicated the British throne. The marriage was dissolved following the granting of a decree nisi in October, 1936, which became final the next year.

TORONTO, Aug. 24 — A five-ton converted officers' headquarters van, packed with modern display material graphically describing the work of the United Church of Canada in the Dominion and overseas, will shortly set out for the Maritimes in an educational plan to inform the members of the United Church about their own church.

The van is called the "Crusaders' Cavalcade." It has travelled all over Western Canada and throughout Ontario and the display material it carries has been seen by more than 300,000 people. A team of speakers accompanies the van.

The exhibits themselves consist of electrified models, illuminated transparencies, artistically painted panels, pictures, maps, curios, moving pictures in sound and colour and many other interesting features.

THE BACHELOR AND THE BOBBY-SOXER

Through riotous comedy romance Cary Grant, Myrna Loy and Shirley Temple Enact Gay Complications Arising From an Adolescent's Crush on a "Stag"

With Cary Grant, Myrna Loy and Shirley Temple in the stellar roles, Dore Schary's production for RKO Radio, "The Bachelor and the Bobby-Soxer," now at the Prince Edward Theatre is offered as a delightful romantic comedy of an artist who becomes involved in romantic complications with a woman jurist and her bobby-sox sister.

The younger girl becomes infatuated with the artist in a big way when he delivers a lecture at her high school, and decides to bring herself to his attention by going to his apartment, where she falls asleep. The artist finds her there at two a. m. and is just about to take her home when the judge bounces in on the trail of her kid sister, and completely misunderstands the situation.

She is all for sending the artist to the penitentiary, but the court psychiatrist points out that the girl's infatuation can be easily cured if she sees enough of the older man. So the artist, to avoid prosecution, is forced to take the bobby-soxer to all sorts of student functions. While this makes the girl's boy-friend jealous, it also results in the artist becoming intrigued with the pretty judge, and the ensuing complications keep the romantic pot boiling merrily.

Grant has one of his most sparkling roles as the hapless artist, and Miss Loy portrays a very human judge, with Shirley ideally cast as the enthusiastic teen-ager. Rudy Vallee is in the cast as an assistant district attorney and an admirer of the judge. Ray Collins and Harry Davenport are a pair of elderly uncles. Johnny Sands is Shirley's schoolboy pal. Don Beddoe, Lillian Randolph, Veda Ann Borg, Dan Tobin and Charles Hailton have other roles.

Irvine Reis directed the offering, and Sidney Sheldon wrote the original story and screenplay.
