CABINET DOES CANADA BONDS NOT DISCUSS TO COMMAND ELECTION GOOD PRICE

Announcement of Which May Be Deferred for Fortnight

(Special to The Guardian.)
OTTAWA, Aug. 18.—At a large meeting of the Federal Cabinet this afternoon Hon. P. C. Larkin, Canadian High Commissioner, in London, discussed with the various ministers, matters concerning Canada's establishment and activities in Great Britain. Beyond that nothing of public interest transpired according to a statement by the Prime Minister following the meeting. This evening the Prime Minister entertained at dinner Hon. Mr. Larkin and a number of the latter's personal friends. Cabinet deliberations will be continued tomorrow. The question of the date of the federal election has not yet been solved and it is possible that the announcement will be delayed until the return to the Capital in about two weeks of His Excellency the Governor General, who has been seeing the Canadian sub-Arctic. With the return at the end of the month the return of Sir Henry Thorne, consideration will be given to the matter of the renewal of his contract as head of the Canadian National Railways, which contract expires the first week of October.

London Times Pays Tribute To Sir Adam Beck

LONDON, Aug. 18.—The newspapers here give prominence to the death of Sir Adam Beck, London, Ont., Chairman of the Ontario Hydro Electric Power Commission. The Times has a column obituary notice in which it praises the courage and dogged determination by which Sir Adam Beck overcame the powerful financial influence that sought to maintain and extend private control over Niagara Falls. The Times says Sir Adam sometimes, in his treatment of private interests, he lived to see his policy justified and to boast that the results were as great as he had ever predicted.

Reach Final Agreement

45 British Warships to Be Scrapped

PORTSMOUTH, Eng., Aug. 18.—In accordance with the decision for naval economies it is understood that 45 British destroyers are shortly to be scrapped. It is also stated that the pay of seamen is to be reduced 15 per cent, which corresponds to the reduction in the cost of living since 1919 as based on official calculations. The officers' pay has already been reduced to this extent.

Sir Thomas White May Be Hydro Commissioner

TORONTO, Ont., Aug. 18.—It is reported today that Premier Ferguson will this week offer the chairmanship of the Provincial Hydro Electric Commission to Sir Thomas White. On former occasions the Prime Minister has declared that his intention is to obtain a commissioner who is neither fanatical attached nor opposed to hydro, a sound business man, and practicable, one with a public record. Queen's Park felt that if Sir Thomas will accept the responsibility, the Premier will have found his ideal.

Prince of Wales In Buenos Ayres

BUENOS AIRES, Aug. 18.—The Prince of Wales faced a full programme today, the second day of his visit to Argentina. This morning he visited the port works and British packing plants and showed great interest in their activities. This afternoon his Royal Highness was to review a band of school children and in the evening he will hold a reception and later attend a gala performance at the opera. Everywhere the Prince appears he is greeted by enthusiastic crowds.

Woman Lost Life In Auto Accident

NEW YORK, Aug. 18.—Confusing the gears of his automobile and then stopping on the accelerator, Harry Lawrence, 35, of 11th St., drove his car into a wall from which he was attempting to back up, into Sheepshead Bay, Brooklyn, yesterday. His wife Anna and a pet collie were drowned. He was in a hospital today in a serious condition.

"Gob" Dies Of Blows

WELLINGTON, N. Z., Aug. 18.—A member of the crew of the U. S. S. Scudder, which was attached to the visiting United States fleet from Glasgow, died yesterday of injuries received during a brawl on Thursday night. It is asserted that a patrolman in defending himself during the brawl was compelled to resort to force against the sailor.

Keeping Some Troops In Cape Breton

SYDNEY, N. S., Aug. 18.—About two hundred and fifty officers and men of different units from Halifax, stationed here during the Cape Breton strike, left here on a special train which pulled out at 10 o'clock this morning. The first and second divisions of the Royal Canadian Artillery, No. 6 detachment of the Royal Canadian Engineers, and the Medical Corps, all stationed at Halifax, made up the outgoing detachment. There are yet about one hundred and fifty soldiers stationed in Cape Breton, most of them at Victoria Park, Sydney, but it is not known when they will evacuate. An interview with an officer at military headquarters this evening it was stated that they "had no idea" how long those remaining would stay here.

Lt.-Col. McMillan To Fuse N. B. Vets

OTTAWA, Aug. 18.—In furtherance of the plan of Field Marshal Earl Haig to unite all Canadian War Veterans in one organization, provisional committees are being formed in each province. LIVES LOST IN FIRST SESSION STREET FIGHTS OF THE P. E. I. AT BERLIN PRESBYTERY

People Fear to Be Abroad at Night—Fascisti and Communists Clash -- Police Beg Assistance of Press.

BERLIN, August 18.—Continuing street fights in the last few days, which already have cost several lives and which have reached such proportions that in certain parts of Berlin the people fear to walk abroad at night lest they be embroiled in battles between Fascisti and Communists have induced the authorities to permit policemen to use firearms in case of necessity. It has become the custom of German Fascisti youth, wearing belted raincoats and carrying weighted rubber clubs, to congregate in the fashionable west end, where they have a cafe as headquarters and attack whom ever they suspect of having Socialist or Republican tendencies. The same methods are pursued by Communists in other parts of the town. The police called a conference of the German press and begged for assistance in maintaining order and public security. The conference was a direct result of attacks on policemen due to two Communist youths being killed by the police in suppressing a demonstration. The police president and the authorities were prepared to protect all peaceful demonstrations, whether staged by Right or Left groups. But when a group of youths, armed with heavy clubs, and when the firing of blank cartridges failed to warn the demonstrators the police felt justified in shooting. The police president expressed regret over the loss of life and said policemen had exact instructions under what circumstances shooting was permissible.

Committed to Trial On Murder Charge

MONCTON, N. B., Aug. 18.—Charged with the murder of Howie Cairns at Harvey, Albert County, on the night of August 11th, Lawrence Doherty, was this afternoon committed to stand trial at the next session of the Albert Supreme Court which opens Sept. 2nd. Doherty's preliminary examination was held at Hopewell Cape before Police Magistrate W. D. Bennett with clerk of the peace Lester Smith prosecuting and J. C. Sherren defending. When called upon to plead the accused, acting upon the advice of his counsel, had nothing to say.

Prefer Squalor To Modern Homes

LONDON, Aug. 18.—Curious revelations of the way people in the East End live are coming out day by day as a result of the strenuous opposition of certain residents of the Limehouse region near the docks to accepting healthy and sanitary homes. Borough Council had an eye on a certain area around Alfa and Carr streets. It is a neighborhood of small, tumble-down houses nearly a century old. Roofs leak, stairs are rotten, and the death rate, especially among infants, is appalling, and the whole region is the sort of place certain individuals point to in showing the misery in which the downtrodden poor exist. The Council is now proposing to clear away the "slums" and to build beautiful new flats, with asphalt pavements, stone stairways, open air at landings and all the latest sanitary improvements. The condemnation of the houses went down like a bomb a few days ago for it seemed merely a formal inquiry, but he met a storm of opposition. Families living in the old houses, even with five or six persons in a bedroom, don't want to leave their squalor, and keep chickens or train carrier pigeons. "And how would any honest man find his way back to the barracks flats?" they ask. For 150 years has the fish curing industry been carried on there. Unsanitary Londoners have been eating finnan haddies smoked in these miserable backyards. "Could fish be cured on stone landings?" Many houses have wireless, and between the howls of multitudinous babies, the residents hear dance music from the big hotels. "Could wire be strung across asphalt court yards?" Limehouse yards and the condemnation commissioner will face a hard fight when he resumes hearings on September 10.

6 Missing in Alps

GRENOBLE, France, Aug. 18.—The death toll among adventurous tourists in the Alps has been exceptionally high this week. The latest disaster is reported from the Bernas Pass, where six persons are believed to have perished yesterday when the rope connecting them snapped and they all fell from a precipitous cliff. Behind a pair of horses hauling a man fell and was killed while scaling little Mont Blanc. Her body was recovered.

Driver Killed By Harness Breaking

SPRINGHILL, Aug. 18.—As the result of an accident while having last week, William Booth, of this town, died in Cottage Hospital. Behind a pair of horses hauling a harness in the barn of Thomas Williams, Main street, when the pulley holding the fork rope to the barn floor pulled out, the entire strain causing the traces on the horses to break. The whiffletree flew back with bullet-like force and struck the unfortunate man in the stomach. He was immediately rushed to the hospital, but was beyond all aid. He leaves a wife and family of young children.

THREE-CORNERED FIGHT FOR NEW YORK MAYORALTY

NEW YORK, Aug. 18.—Former Secretary of State John J. Lyons has announced he would contest the Republican nomination for the mayoralty. Petitions are being circulated putting him in the race against Frank D. Waterman, Republican-Chicago candidate, and William M. Bennett, Independent.

Diamond Pipe Found

JOHANNESBURG, Aug. 18. A true diamond pipe (the sort in which diamonds are found) has been discovered at Mwanza, in Tanganyika territory, by a party of South Africans, according to reports from East Africa. The diamonds are said to be exceptionally pure, a parcel recently dispatched from Mwanza averaging a value of £8 per carat.

Harvesters Break 500 Coach Windows

TORONTO, Ont., Aug. 18.—Toronto Union Station was crowded all day today with harvest bands waiting for the harvest specials to the west which leave tonight at 11 o'clock over both Canadian Pacific and Canadian National systems. Some disorder was shown during the night among the crowd who, among other things, smashed 500 coach windows. It is estimated that 10,000 harvesters left the city last night and today.
