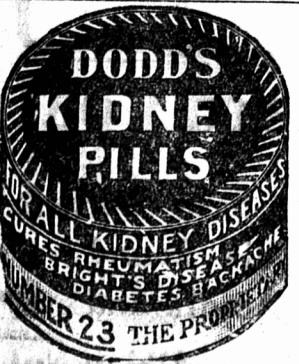

TO LIMIT SHOWS.

SASKATOON, Jan. 8.—Attorney-General Turgeon has informed Mr. Robillard, a leading picture show man here, that the Legislature will pass a Bill to raise the license from \$20 to \$300, and further that the number of picture theatres in the city will be limited to one for every 5,000 of the population.
