**18 Year-Old Boy Held For Wrecking Train**  
NEW YORK, Dec. 8.—Fred Poller,  
18 years old, of 329 Walnut street,  
Newark, was arrested yesterday by  
the Newark police, charged with  
wrecking a passenger train on the  
Central Railroad near Port New-  
ark. The wrecking of the train  
took place on route from Elizabeth-  
port to Newark.

Poller, the detectives say, sta-  
tioned himself at Maple Creek, a  
short distance from Port Newark.  
With a rod of iron he broke the  
switch lock, it is said, and placed  
four iron bolts in the switch after  
swinging it open. Asked for his  
reason for wrecking the train, the  
police say the only excuse he gave  
was that he saw it in the movies.  
As the engine passed through the  
switch it turned over on its side,  
bringing the tender and the first  
coach with it. Two other coaches  
were derailed. None of the crew  
or passengers were injured.

There is evidence of gorgeous lux-  
ury and extravagance of all kinds  
is evident from the ruins that  
the citizens of Pompeii before the  
fall of the city utilized a system of  
water works and a lead piping.  
Sailing on the blue waters of the  
Bay of Naples, the vessel reached  
Capri Island, dotted with the vil-  
las of wealthy Europeans. From  
there they visited Genoa and then  
travelled to Nice, the most famous  
tourist resort in Southern France.  
Morning from Nice to Monaco they  
reached Monte Carlo, and took in

the famous Casino. Leaving Monte  
Carlo they reached Marseilles and  
returned again to London, where  
they took passage on November  
29th for home on board the C. P. R.  
liner, Empress of France.

Before returning home Mr.  
Rogers visited Wales, and was  
most hospitably treated there.  
This part of his trip is especially  
interesting to him as he saw in  
Carmarthen the ancient church  
where his father, the late Mr. Benj.  
Rogers was christened, and also  
discovered the register of his birth.  
The house where his father was  
born is still standing in good con-  
dition. Mr. Rogers also saw in  
Carmarthen the church where his  
great grandfather preached for  
forty years. In this section of  
Wales seventy-five per cent of the  
population still speak the native  
Welsh.

While in Paris he saw three  
hundred thousand people at a horse  
race, where the excitement ran  
very high.

In Italy Mr. Rogers noticed that  
business has not recovered from  
the effects of the war quite so  
rapid as in France, which has such  
wonderful resources that today  
their exports are a hundred per-  
cent greater than their imports.  
Throughout Europe, however, the  
business outlook is improving. In  
other European countries the busi-  
ness outlook, though not perhaps  
as promising, is at any rate im-  
proving.
