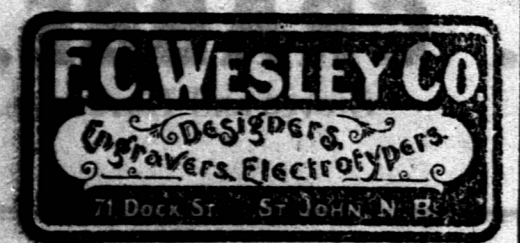

KNIGHTS OF PYTHIAS.

The order of Knights of Pythias was instituted in 1831. Its avowed cardinal principles are friendship, charity and benevolence, and it was originally designed to gather into one great fraternity the men "who appreciate the true meaning of friendship; who are cautious in word and act; who love truth; who are brave in defending the right; whose honor is untarnished." The qualifications for membership stipulate that the applicant shall be a white male, 21 years of age, a believer in a Supreme Being, of sound mind and body, able to read and write and not a gambler, saloon-keeper, bar-tender or liquor dealer.

There are supreme, grand and subordinate lodges. While the bulk of the half million members of the order are residents of the United States, there are many thousands of them in the several Provinces of Canada. The Grand Lodge of the Maritime Provinces was organized in June, 1883, and it is this body which today will begin its annual session in Pythian Castle in this city. The Endowment Rank of the order was established in 1877 and provides life insurance in sums of five hundred, one, two or three thousand dollars each. This rank being optional, includes only about one tenth of the total membership, of the order, and yet had paid out to the families of its deceased members over \$12,000,000 previous to April 1898.

The Maritime Grand Lodge, K. of P. will meet with a hearty welcome, on this their first meeting in Charlottetown.

The 4th Regiment Band whose members have contributed so much to the enjoyment of the lovers of music, are inviting to the city Mr. Owen A. The Government of the United States, which forbids the transmission of ordinary lottery tickets through the mails, has been taken to task for using the lottery system in the recent disposal of certain public lands in Oklahoma. One defence set up is that the land of Canaan was disposed of by lot by Israelites of old. Another defence is that the Government made no profit out of the transaction, which thus differs in a most essential particular from the ordinary lottery. Neither of these defences is wholly good. The lot in the case of the distribution of the lands of Canaan was entirely without money and without price. Every head of family was assured of a tract of land and he paid no money. In Oklahoma nearly 100,000 persons paid their money, and only 13,000, or less than one out of 12 got any land. It may be true that the Government did not receive any more money than if another and fairer method of distribution had been applied. That only eliminated one immoral feature of the ordinary lottery, an important one, it is true, but not the only one. The plan adopted is not defensible on moral or Scriptural grounds.

THE CITY COUNCIL

An Unimportant Session Held Last Night

DUKE OF CORNWALL

To be Presented With an Address - The Police Want More Money.

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held last night. All the Councilors were present with the exception of Coun. Lyons. The bill for extinction after discussion was allowed to stand over. A communication was read from the police force asking an increase of pay. The members of the Council expressed themselves in favor of the increase but decided it would be impossible to grant prayer of petition owing to the fact that it should have been presented previous to the making up of the estimates. His Worship the Mayor, Couns. Whar, M Donald, Bro... were appointed a committee to draft an address to be presented by a delegation of the Duke of Cornwall at Halifax. Opposition was made to the expenditure of money. The wrong naming of Granville street was ordered to be corrected. His Worship called the Council's attention to the visit of the Press Association and after the Clerk had been instructed to ask that the lumber be removed from the front of the Drill Shed and the militia be requested to drill in the Park in the future, the council adjourned.

The Australian defence bill, which has passed its second reading provides for calling out in an emergency every able bodied man between 18 years and 60 and contemplates an expenditure of nearly \$5,000,000 a year for naval defence. This is far ahead of what Canada has been doing.

Court Tignish.-60 per cent on parade, distance travelled from Court room (road and rail), 17 miles.

I have been informed that one point mile travelled was allowed each Court and the percentage of members on parade added thereto.

The calculation on this basis would be:

Majority in favor of Ct. Tignish-70 pts. Had Court Tignish only one member on parade according to the same system of calculation it would still have a majority of 12 points over Court Wiltshire.

The judges might with equal fairness have made their calculations on the basis of yards travelled instead of miles. The odds would then appear so greatly in favor of Court Tignish that surely every one would see that Court Wiltshire had no show. For instance-
