At Maritime Convention

DR. PAUL M. LIMBERT, AUTHORITY ON GROUP LEADERSHIP COMING TO MARITIMES



Maritime ministers and leaders in Christian Education will have the opportunity of hearing one of the continent's experts in group leadership at the coming Sunday School convention to be held in Saint John, October 22 to 24, in the person of Dr. Paul M. Limbert, President-elect of the Canadian Council of Christian Education (International Y.M.C.A.) College.

Born in Pennsylvania, Dr. Limbert is a graduate of both Lancaster and Union Theological Seminaries, and holds a Columbia doctorate. After several years as Professor of Education and Director of Springfield, and hurried back from the Maritimes for his inauguration. During the war Dr. Limbert was given special responsibility for religious education in the American Y. M. C. A. He is now in Europe traveling with the special education mission sent by the State Department to evaluate work being done in Germany, and will be in a position to give first hand impressions of conditions in Europe.

Make Attempt To Avoid Deportation

DAVIDSON HAIFA, Palestine, Sept. 23.—(AP)—Approximately 600 unauthorized Jewish immigrants were transferred to a British troopship today for trans-shipment to Cyprus after nearly 100 of them had dived over the side of the blockade runner Palmakh in a desperate but unsuccessful attempt to swim to the Holy Land. Six soldiers leaped in among the frantic swimmers and fastened ropes to them, as British soldiers and teams of up with Palestine police in preventing the mass escape plan. Police and navy launches scurried through the waters picking up the immigrants. After the swimmers had been rounded up, the transfer of 588 refugees to the British troopship Ocean Star was accomplished without further incident. But even as the Palmakh's passengers were embarking on the troopship, the British ship arrived in Haifa harbor with 130 more illegal immigrants, who also presumably will be sent to detention camps on Cyprus.

Police Get First Call In Weeks

HAMILTON, Sept. 23.—(CP)—Provincial Police brought here for strike duty at the Lakeside of Canada plant several weeks ago, were called out for the first time Saturday night when a fight broke out between strikers and non-strikers. The battle occurred as non-strikers were landed from a company boat alongside the Lakeside, about 15 miles east of the city. Union pickets, apparently learning of the intended landing of 50 to 60 men who were leaving the plant for the week-end, went into action some 50 strong and fists swung for 15 minutes. By the time the provincials arrived the fight was over. No one was reported seriously injured. Meanwhile a return vote sponsored by the company was in full swing among the 4,831 employees and counting is expected to start by the middle of the week. Upwards of 2,500 men have returned to the job and the United Steelworkers of America (C.I.O.), starting the 11th week of its wages-hours strike at Canada's basic steel plants, urged workers to multiply the vote by marking their ballots "yes."

FALL SHIPMENT EGGS BEGIN TO BRITAIN

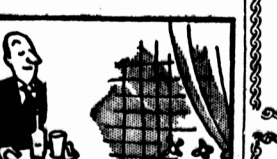
For the first time, a shipment of eggs held in refrigeration from spring storage until fall delivery to Britain was loaded at Montreal aboard S. Corrales, September 23. It consisted of 58,000 cases of 30 dozen each brought to Montreal in railway refrigerator cars from as far west as Alberta.

Vicar Dismissed

(By The Canadian Press) HULL, Eng., Sept. 23.—Rev. Trevelyan William Sweeting, vicar of South Crossand, was convicted of common assault but dismissed under the Probation of Offenders Act when brought into court recently for jecting from a churchyard W. G. Lewis, a member of the congregation. Evidence was given that Mr. Lewis, with another reporter, attended the funeral of a South Crossand sportsman to get the names of the mourners. Mr. Sweeting ordered them to leave the churchyard but they refused. "I will wait for the police," said Mr. Lewis. Mr. Sweeting took his seat and twisted it behind his back as though to frog-march him from the burial ground. Finally he was pushed, without resistance, from the churchyard. The magistrate found the case was proved but dismissed it on payment of four shillings (90¢) costs.

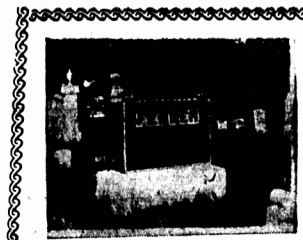
