In Memoriam

JOSEPH B. STEWART

In the passing of Joseph B. Stewart, Harrington has lost a universally respected and lifelong resident. Mr. Stewart was the youngest and last surviving son of a family of eight sons and a daughter. His father Charles Stewart emigrated to this country from Scotland and cleared the home place at Harrington from the virgin forest here Joseph Stewart was born and here he lived his long lifetime of eighty years. Mr. Stewart was an energetic and successful farmer and in his younger days took an active interest in the community life. For many years he was Elder for the Harrington Church and his staunch faith in God's overruling providence and fatherly love was an unfailing source of comfort and peace in his long illness of two years. For the last year of his life he was confined to his bed and was at times much distressed with weakness, yet no word of complaint passed his lips but ever appreciation of God's mercy in sparing him severe pain and suffering surrounded him with the comforts of home and his loved daughters and son to care for him. Mr. Stewart completed his earthly pilgrimage on Friday, March 4th 1921, and on the following Sabbath the funeral service was conducted in his late home by his pastor Rev. Thos. A. Wilson who spoke from the text Ezra 8:22 "The hand of our God is upon all them for good that seek him." The funeral was largely attended and a long cortege followed to the cemetery at Sherwood. Burial was in the presence of the pall bearers were John MacCallum, Charles Greor, Herbert Jones, Edward Shaw, Herbert Stewart and Lester Melninn. Mr. Stewart whose ten year old daughter, Laura May and Ethel Blanche and a son, Charles Edward, who have the sympathy of the community in their bereavement.

THE HEALER THAT EVERYBODY NEEDS

er of Canada were the principal speakers at the annual dinner of St. George's Society in New York at the Waldorf Astoria Saturday night. Five members and guests attended, women and men dining together for the first time in the history of the society. Sir Auckland who received great applause remarked that while St. George's societies were dining in celebration of the day in Canada, Australia India and other parts of the world, no dinners were being held in England because of the labor troubles. England is only one-fifth as large as Texas, small and not particularly fertile, he said, but rich in its men and women, that is the treasure of it. Labor troubles, the Great Britain Ambassador said are only another form of the old fight fought in England by Democratic government. The trouble was part of the war which disarranged the machinery of Europe but difficulties would be overcome. Sir George Foster spoke on the part Canada played in the war, her lavishing men and money for the cause. "We believe in Canada," he continued, "that this was an investment for the peace of the world. A good deal of what you might call maudlin sympathy has been displayed toward Germany today." This was greeted with tremendous applause. "If Germany won the war," went on the speaker, "what would have been the terms of peace? "All through the war the Germans kept up the spirit of their people by continually saying: 'when we beat them we will make them pay all expenses of the war,' and there is no doubt they would have done this."
