Contract Bridge

A Question of Degree

A bridge player may be justly classified as "good" even though he makes a few errors in every session. It all depends on the kind of errors. He cannot expect to be rated very highly if he plays as East did in today's deal.

South dealer. Neither side vulnerable.

The bidding:

South's 4-3-3 hand pattern and his 5½-plus honor-tricks made the two-notrump opening deal. It was equally correct for North to raise to game at notrump. Obviously it's hard to be strong, but the raise of two notrumps is obligatory on two queens and a jack. If North-South had not had a little bad luck, in that they held together every high spade from the ace to the ten and yet could win only three spade tricks, the game contract probably would have been cold. As it was, South had to get some help from the enemy.

East-West started off well when West led his eight of hearts. Declarer's thrice-guarded queen proved to be worthless, and the defenders found themselves in possession of the first four tricks. On the

last heart East discarded a low spade. A spade and a club had been discarded from dummy on the run of hearts. West now exited with a spade. Declarer reached for the queen, and then led the queen of clubs through East for a finesse. East belligerently covered with the king. South won, tested the diamond break by casting his three high cards in the suit, and when he saw the non-break, shifted back to clubs, leading the nine through West. The latter ducked without hesitation, but South's only good chance was to finesse against the club ten, so he did just that. Three notrump, bid and made.

East's cover of the club queen was very bad bridge. He should have wanted to cover the jack, when and if led. Of course you see the difference, dear reader?
