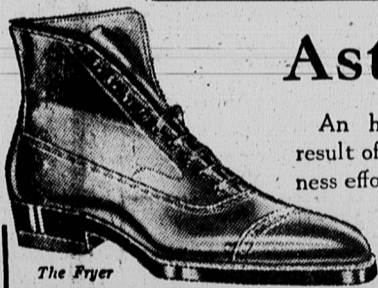

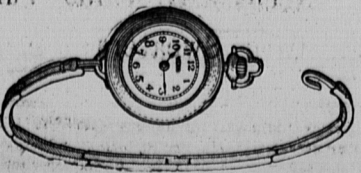

A Good Fertilizer

The Guardian's advertising columns today inform the public that a good quality of mussel mud is available to the farmers within reach of the Bays and Rivers on the southern portion of the province and by rail to other points. After overcoming the delays, difficulties and disappointments which are inseparable from a new and difficult undertaking, this company is now carrying on the work with success. Larger quantities of this valuable fertilizer than generally supposed is found in these waters some beds too deep, others too hard for ordinary diggers. The only way this can be handled is by the plant now at work which consists of a large scow fitted with machinery to operate a dredging clam shell bucket for loading and discharging. One of the best labor saving features is that in discharging the mud can be placed in the farmers carts, thus saving the trouble of shovelling. A plant of this kind necessarily costs money. Operating expenses are heavy and it is only by the co-operation of the farmers that it can be operated. If farmers join together for the purpose of unloading four or five teams an unload a scowload of about 100 tons in from two to three hours. This will save time in operating and spare a few hours for the sake of yarding a supply that they can take home at leisure. When it is considered that every 100 tons means a good dressing of the best fertilizer known to farmers, apart from stable manure, for ten acres of land, one can well understand the value of this undertaking to the country. It is to be commended to all farmers within convenient reach of it.

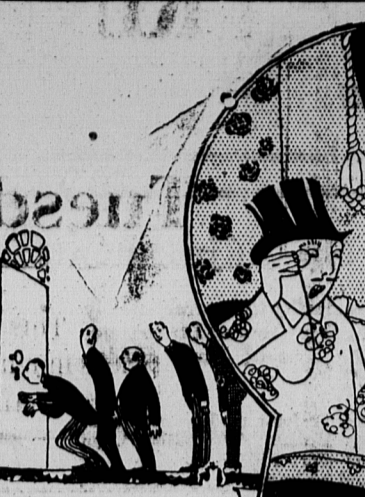

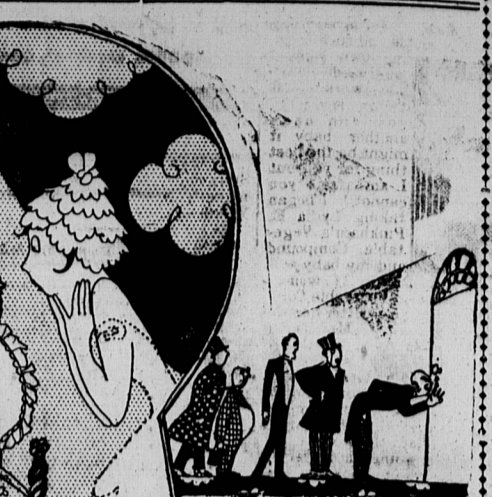

DUBLIN MORE HOPEFUL OVER PEACE PARLEY

LONDON, Sept. 27.—On the eve of the dispatch of Premier Lloyd George's reply to Eamon De Valera's latest note, reports from Dublin indicate the utmost confidence in Sinn Fein quarters that the conference will be held, and that communications between British and Irish leaders will contain nothing likely to create an obstacle to an eventual peace.

The Sinn Fein cabinet will convene on Thursday to discuss Lloyd George's note and to frame its reply. Meanwhile, precautions are being taken at Belfast to prevent a recurrence of the violence which marked the week end, which can not but prove disastrous to peace efforts on both sides if repeated. Colonel Carter Campbell, military commandant in Ulster has been appointed military governor in complete charge of both soldiery and constabulary now swarming through the riot district. Several companies of extra troops drafted from other localities have been taken to the scene of the bitterest fighting Belfast has known this year and are now occupying improvised barracks around the disturbed zone, forming practically an iron ring around the quarter. Special police, demobilized early in progress of peace negotiations will be re-mobilized at once, following orders issued Tuesday. Belfast has been comparatively quiet during the last 24 hours.
