Five pigs farrowed between January 1st and February 15th and farrowed the property of the contestant constitute an entry. Entries which will be scored in July, must be made before pigs are six weeks old. No Competition will be held unless there are fifteen entries. An entrance fee of \$1.00 will be charged.
