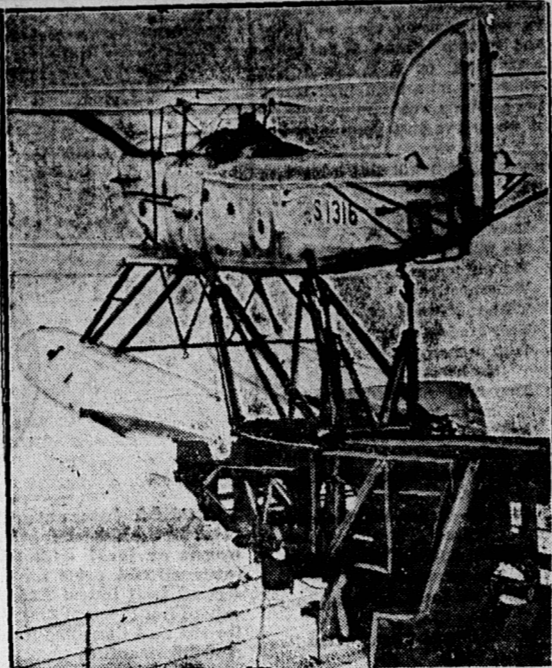

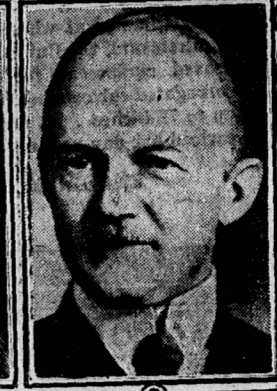
BARRYMORE BAGS ANOTHER TROPHY

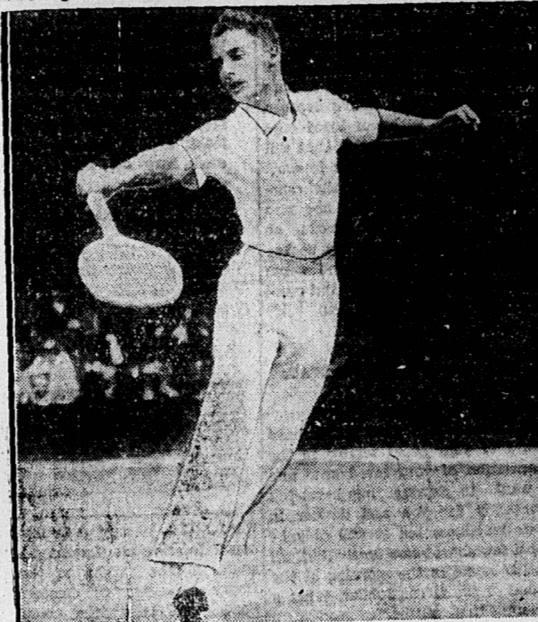


Y. M. C. A. CONFERENCE TO BE HELD IN TORONTO

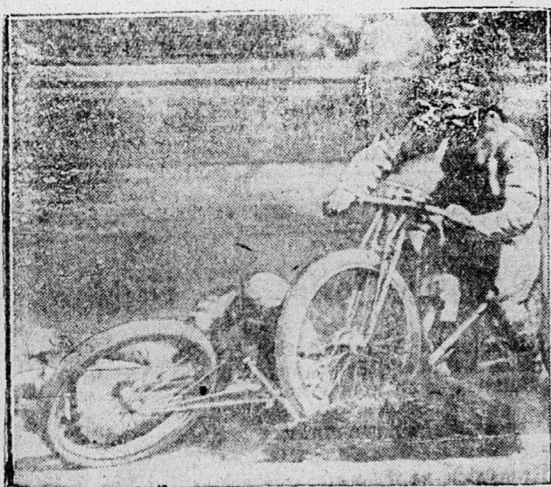

As indicated on the ABOVE map, their aeromoose factory, Churchill, Baker Lake, Aklavik, Point Barrow and Nome. From Point Barrow the line of flight passes down across the Bering sea into Kamchatka peninsula, thence to Japan by way of the Kuril Islands.
