BOOST THE GARDEN PROVINCE

Opt. Msm. Co-operation Work—The Only Means of Progress as Set Forth in Letter Issued by the President of the Associated Boards of Trade to the Farmers Institutes

Mr. J. O. Hyndman, President of the Prince Edward Island Associated Boards of Trade, has written a letter to the president of each of the Farmers Institutes in this Province.

The present Car Ferry was placed on the Borden-Tormentine route as an experiment, and very few persons, if any, thought that a boat could be built to cope successfully with the ice conditions in the straits through the whole winter season.

The object in organizing the Associated Boards of Trade of Prince Edward Island, according to its Constitution, was to promote the general welfare of the Province.

Early this year a Tourist Association was formed in Nova Scotia and Premier Armstrong announced recently that the receipts from the tourist trade this year in Nova Scotia had increased over one million dollars compared with 1922.
