SMALL HOGS

Owing to the tendency in some sections lately to place hogs on the market before properly finished, Davis & Fraser have been obliged to notify their buyers throughout the province that they must positively refuse to handle any such hogs that do not come up to the regular grade required for packing, which must not be less than 110 lbs. An occasional small hog, down to 100 lbs., it plump and well fattened may be taken at a reduction of one cent per lb. from the price of standard weight, but any lighter than that cannot be received at any price. Farmers would do well to take particular notice of this matter, as it is really in their own interest to continue the feeding of their hogs until in condition to bring the highest price. All practical authorities are agreed that it is in the last few weeks of feeding that the chief profit is to be secured in hog raising, while if the present enviable reputation of Island pork products, as packed by Davis & Fraser, is to be maintained, it is necessary that farmers supply the grade of pork required. 9227-3-29mWfm

LONDON STOCK EXCHANGE

LONDON, March 30.—With the Stock Exchange again almost ended, there is much speculation as to how many members intend to resign, or to suspend their membership for a year. Various wild estimates have been given, ranging from 500 to 600, but the only figures published so far at the exchange show that fourteen members are falling out; fifty-two authorized, and forty-four unauthorized clerks have been withdrawn. They have a year in which to engage in other business, and at the end of that time can resume their membership without having to pay the heavy entrance fees. Of course, there are a number engaged on active service, but these have the privilege of remaining out until after the war.

ACT TO INCORPORATE P. E. I. FOX BREEDERS' ASS'N

The following is the text of the Bill to be submitted to the Legislature for the purpose of incorporating the Fox Breeders' Association, on which the fox conference devoted considerable time during the past three months: No. BILL 1915

An Act to incorporate the Prince Edward Island Fox Breeders' Association.

BE IT ENACTED by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Assembly of the Province of Prince Edward Island as follows: 1. The Act shall be cited as "The Fox Breeders' Association Act."

2. In this act, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression "Association" means "The Prince Edward Island Fox Breeders' Association."

3. The Association shall have for its object the promotion and regulation of the Fox Industry of Prince Edward Island.

(a) By keeping a record of the breeding and origin of all foxes held in captivity by members of the Association; by collecting, preserving and publishing data and documents relating to the same.

(b) By establishing standards of breeding and by carrying out a system of registration.

(c) By adopting means from time to time for the promotion of individuals and companies engaged in the propagation and breeding of foxes in compliance with this Act or any by-law or regulation thereof.

(d) By maintaining an efficient inspection, so as to enable the Association to prevent, detect and punish fraud.

(e) By compiling statistics of the industry and furnishing official and authentic information in regard thereto.

(f) By exercising an oversight of the personnel and of the finances of all fox companies incorporated or to be incorporated in this Province.

(g) And for these purposes to have power to make all needful contracts and agreements.

4. That the said Association may acquire, purchase, hold, possess and dispose of any real or personal estate within this Province, or may sell, lease, mortgage, or dispose of same for the benefit of the Association, and that it may have the power to sue and be sued.

5. That J. E. B. McCready, E. R. Brown, R. E. Spillet, Chester McClure, W. B. Prowse, James A. Johnston, W. B. Hayes, J. W. Callbeck, A. C. Saunders, F. L. Rogers, J. D. McIntyre, W. H. Prowse, W. L. Poole, J. Frank Sterns, J. D. Stewart, W. E. Cameron and all others who may become members of the Association and be by this Act created and are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of "The Prince Edward Island Fox Breeders' Association" and by that name shall have all the general powers and privileges incident to a corporation by the Act of the General Assembly of this Island, entitled, "An Act relating to Corporate Bodies," and the amendments thereto.

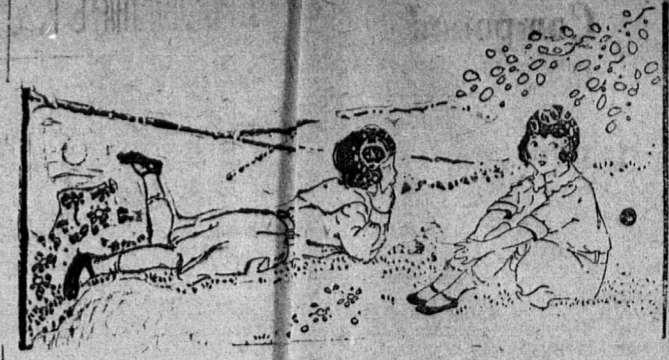
