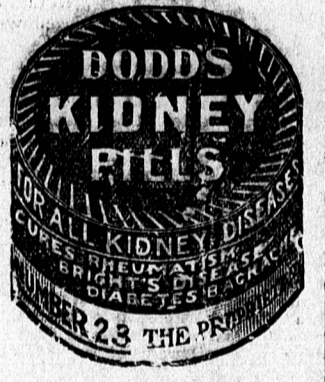
THE HALIFAX. The S. S. Halifax arrived in Charlottetown at an early hour yesterday morning with a good cargo and the following passengers:

LATE MRS. EVELYN CLAY. With further references to the lamented death of Mrs. Evelyn Clay, wife of Mr. Fulton J. Clay at Spokane, Washington, briefly recorded some days ago, it is learned by private letters to friends in Charlottetown, that her illness was of short duration. She had returned from a most enjoyable visit to her daughter at Seattle, apparently in her usual health. Shortly afterwards she had an attack of laryngitis. Her condition grew rapidly worse and she succumbed within a few days.
