CANADA'S ATTRACTIVE EXHIBIT AT THE FESTIVAL OF EMPIRE

LONDON, June 2.—Enormous crowds have been visiting the Festival of Empire, Imperial Exhibition and Pageant of London during the past week, the fine weather that has been prevailing drew Londoners and Coronation visitors to the Crystal Palace in thousands.

The various dominion government buildings are now completed and the exhibition now represents a complete display of the commercial, industrial and domestic life of the empire. Nearly all the over-seas dominions have representative displays, that of Canada being undoubtedly one of the finest exhibits of the kind ever witnessed.

The stately exterior of the Canadian Pavilion Palace, which has been erected by the dominion government at a cost of £70,000 gives no hint to the loveliness of the interior. As the central doorway, the beauty of the place is unexpected. The coup d'oeil is all so unexpected. The graceful effigy of peace, looking, rightly enough, towards the portrait of King Edward VII, the Peacemaker, holding aloft a garland and surrounded by palms, is the first object so compelling in its beauty and interest, consists of a double row of white pillars, richly ornamented with floral design, each having a large decorative capital resembling an enormous goblet, filled with grain and grasses of every variety from the land of the Maple Leaf. Palms and fern fronds cluster round the base of each white pillar. The crimson-draped "tie beams" of the centre of the hall lend a rich note of color against the white ceiling, which is begemmed with electric lights.

On a grey ground, relieved with crimson, are depicted scenes of Canadian life in every part of the dominion, carried out in a very realistic manner with grain, which makes the wheat lands seem very near, as we look at them, and almost wave before our eyes, so wonderful is the illusion. "Transparent" pictures glow down from above, so finely tinted that they carry with them the very breath of the prairie, the mountain, the lakes, and the primeval forests.

It is a grand sight, this collection of living pictures of Canada in miniature, which creates the longing to behold the wonders and beauties of the vast dominion.

A feature of much interest to the naturalist and lover of wild life in wild places is the panorama on the south side of the building. The conquest of the wild by the settler and the civilizing influence of man, and the gradual gravitation of the wilder species of fauna to the mountains, is very clearly shown. The animals themselves are a never failing source of interest, and have a wonderfully life-like appearance.

The panorama of the fruit lands of the dominion is lovely, and is an inspiring sight. Apple and peach orchards form the background, while in

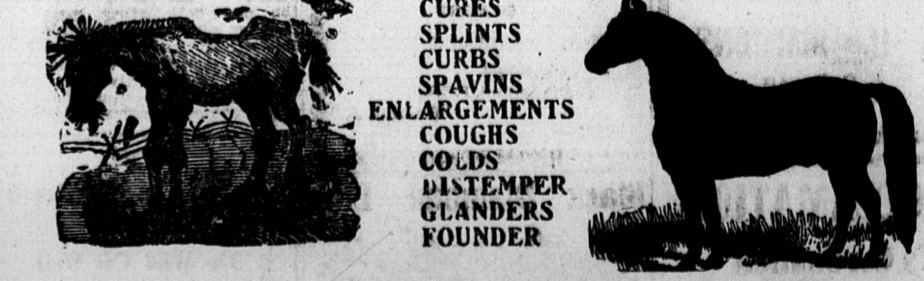
